Last months meeting was held on February 5<sup>th</sup>. 31 members were present, and was the third highest attendance total ever and highest since the March 2007 meeting.

**MINUTES** – President Tim Z called the meeting to order at 7:00.

Tim reviewed the minutes of the last meeting. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes. Michael T. gave the Treasurers report and stated we have \$898.70 in the club account. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers report. (Remember that any adult member may see the complete Treasurer's report by simply requesting to view it at the meeting.)

Tim and welcomed the return of longtime member Bob Gilmore and also introduced new members Linda Gilmore, wife of Bob, Lara Hansen, wife of Kerry, and Art Nash. Tim reviewed the upcoming coin shows.

Dave F. gave a short talk on his trip to New York City to attend the International Coin Show.

Tim Z. talked about his attending the FUN show in Florida. He indicated that there were over 10,000 people in attendance, and that many paper money collectors were seeing

large declines in the value of their collections based on prices at the show.

Gertrude K. asked if anyone knew anything about Braille paper money. This generated some discussion amongst club members.

Dave F. indicated that he had a free copy of the current Numismatist magazine for anyone who wanted it.

### **SHOW and TELL**

Tim Z. had a 1987 ASE Error where the obverse and reverse are super weakly struck in the center of the coin only. He also showed an example of one of the last French Francs minted in 2001 before switching to the Euro. The coin was made of silver and of a wavy construction. His last coin was a 1924 Peru Coin that was minted at a US mint. The coin had a very full strike and was frosted. Tim was told that the coin had been heated to cause the frosting to appear.

Kerry H. had a Morgan Silver dollar that his grandfather gave to him in a card the day he was born. The coin had toned except where the scotch tape had held the coin to the card in the shape of an X.

Dave F. had an 1856 Flying Eagle Cent that he had obtained from a collection. Only problem was that it was a counterfeit. It had been made by altering the date of an 1858 FE cent.

August N. showed his completed 50 states quarter collection that was in a cube holder.

Stuart R. had one of the new Native American Dollars. They are a Sacagawea dollar with a new reverse. Tim Z. made note of an interesting offer you can take advantage of. Buy 500 Native American dollars from the US Mint, get free shipping, and by using your credit card you can get credit in frequent flyer miles or "cash back on your credit card purchases" points for the \$500 dollars you "spent". ©

Don K. showed some informational pamphlets from Numismatics International Club, an example of the American Tax Token Collectors club newsletter, and an Error Scope-(CONECA) publication a club for error coin collectors.
