The monthly Northside Coin Club meeting will be held on Thursday June 4th, 2009 at 7 PM (doors open at 6:30) at the Cimarron Village Community Building in Broomfield, see our web site <u>www.northsidecoinclub.org</u> for directions. The program for this month will be "Do Dollars Make Sense" given by our own Stuart R. The program will focus on the use of Dollar bills and Dollar Coins and would it make sense to eliminate one or the other.

<u>COIN of the MONTH</u> – Sacagawea or Presidential Dollar. (If possible a higher grade, nice collector coin, preferably un-circulated).

[The "Coin of the Month" works as follows. Bring one coin, of the type described as the featured coin of the month, preferably in a 2x2 or flip. If you bring a coin, you will get a ticket in the drawing and your coin goes into the pot. We then draw one ticket and the winner gets the entire pot of coins that were featured.

<u>SHOW and TELL</u> – bring some interesting item from your collection that you would like to show the members and give a quick (1 minute) talk on.

Last months meeting was held on May 7th. 23 members were present and we also had 2 guests. Anne Haddox, who is developing an interest in coins and is working on a Presidential Dollar collection and Joanne Lueloff, who lives in the neighborhood and is a friend of our very own Don K.

MINUTES – President Tim Z. called the meeting to order at 7:09 pm.

Tim reviewed the minutes of the last meeting. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes. Michael T. gave the Treasurers report and stated we have \$1165.09 in the club account. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers report. (Remember that any adult member may see the complete Treasurer's report by simply requesting to view it at the meeting.)

Tim introduced the 2 guests.

Tim reviewed the upcoming coin shows. Made special note of the Denver Coin Expo held in May and the Colorado Springs Coin Show to be held over the July 4th weekend. An announcement was made that NSCC member John B. (although he hasn't paid his 2009 dues yet) was profiled in the May issue of the Numismatist magazine. Congratulations John.

Stuart R. announced that he had obtained a 2009 Lincoln cent in change and it was available for viewing. He also announced he was working on a poster containing a timeline of United States Coinage. He requested you come and take a look at it and give him feedback.

There was a quick Show and Tell session. Dave Wi. showed off his 19th Century Type Set he has been working on. He indicated he likes 19th Century Type because he thinks it contains many beautiful designs. He also indicated that a few of the coins were replicas,

as he couldn't afford the real thing.

Tom B. had a large Coin or Token, he wasn't sure what it was, and he was asking for help from club members to tell him what it might be.

Tim Z. brought in a coin he felt was a classic example of Market Grading. It was made in the 1940s to pay the Saudi Arabians for oil.

Don K. said he had been to the Bank and asked if they had any "new" banknotes. They showed him that they had some of the older 1st generation "new" banknotes.

COIN QUIZ

The coin quiz was to be given this month by the last quiz winner, Dave F. But due to time issues, the quiz was not given. It will be given some time in the coming months.

PROGRAM – Tim Z. gave the program on coin conservation. He provided a handout of recommended supplies along with notes and tips. Tim's best piece of advice was "Don't Do It!" His recommendation was to only do something to a coin when, if nothing is done the coin will get worse. Tim gave a demonstration on various coins. He showed how to remove green PVC goo from a coin with Acetone. He used MS70 on some coins to remove gunk around the letters. He also demonstrated the use of e-Z-est dip on some slightly toned silver coins. He returned one to having brilliant luster. The last piece of advice on his handout was that don't even think about trying to clean copper or brass coins.

The "Coin of the Month", which was Canadian Coin, consisting of a pot of 8 coins, was won by Steve L.
