

# NORTHSIDE COIN CLUB NEWSLETTER

## November 2009 Issue

The monthly Northside Coin Club meeting will be held on Thursday November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2009 at 7 PM (doors open at 6:30) at the Cimarron Village Community Building in Broomfield, see our web site [www.northsidecoinclub.org](http://www.northsidecoinclub.org) for directions. The program for this month will be “Collecting Paper Money” given by Leonard Lashaway.

**COIN of the MONTH** – Silver (War time) Jefferson Nickel. (If possible a higher grade, nice collector coin, preferably un-circulated).

[The “Coin of the Month” works as follows. Bring one coin, of the type described as the featured coin of the month, preferably in a 2x2 or flip. If you bring a coin, you will get a ticket in the drawing and your coin goes into the pot. We then draw one ticket and the winner gets the entire pot of coins that were featured.

**SHOW and TELL** – bring some interesting item from your collection that you would like to show the members and give a quick (1 minute) talk on.

**MINUTES** – President Tim Z. called the meeting to order at 7:11 pm.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes of the last meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers report. (Remember that any adult member may see the complete Treasurer’s report by simply requesting to view it at the meeting.)

The upcoming coin shows were reviewed.

Tim Z. asked for feedback from club members on how he felt our club was meeting the club member’s needs and expectations. Tim asked how many club members were also members of other clubs. The only members present that indicated that they were members of other clubs were Mark H., Tim Z., and Don K. Tim went on to give his impressions and summarize what other local clubs did and how he felt we were different. The club members were overall happy with our clubs format and activities and also provided some feedback to Tim’s question. Tim Z. encouraged members to bring extra coins to sell in a non-auction method.

### Old Business

Coin Show –Tim Z. indicated that he would try to have a Board meeting in mid October. (Secretaries note; no Board meeting was held).

Dave F. reminded the club of the collection that the club has been asked to evaluate and sell. One idea was to have an auction that might also be attended by other local coin

clubs. Tim Z. discussed various options on how to auction it or sell it. Details on what will be done; will be discussed by the Board at the next Board meeting.

New Business

Tim Z. asked for interest in the club taking a trip to the ANA in Colorado Springs. This will be discussed at the next Board meeting.

**SHOW & TELL**

Terry S. showed off a couple of Proof sets, one from the Cayman Islands and one from Jamaica.

Don K. had two “Coins” the size of So Called Dollars made out of Aluminum but are not in the book. Columbus is on the Obverse, but they have 1893 Presidential candidates on the Reverse. One had the candidates, Grover Cleveland and Adlai Stevenson. One piece was for the Republican candidates and the other piece was for the Democrats. The reason that these are not considered So Called Dollars is because of the political nature of the pieces.

**COIN QUIZ**

**PROGRAM** – The program was presented by Tim Z. and was on Indian Head Cents.
