**COIN of the MONTH** – Jefferson “Silver Wartime” Nickel. (A nice, no problems, coin that you, as a collector, would like to have, would be appreciated).

[The “Coin of the Month” works as follows. Bring one coin, of the type described as the featured coin of the month, preferably in a 2x2 or flip. If you bring a coin, you will get a ticket in the drawing and your coin goes into the pot. We then draw one ticket and the winner gets the entire pot of coins that were featured.]

**SHOW and TELL** – Bring some interesting item from your collection that you would like to show the members and give a quick (1 minute) talk on.

## Minutes, Notes, and Happenings of last months' meeting

Last month's meeting was held on October 6<sup>th</sup>. There were 21 members and 1 guest present.

President Dave F. called the meeting to order at 7:03.

We had one new member join the NSCC, his name is Jonathan D., and he just started collecting again after he found his old coin collection at his Mother's house. We also had one guest, a young man named Noah D. Dave had his stack old coin magazines and Coin World newspapers, which were available for club members to borrow and read. He also gave a quick rundown on some of the interesting articles including the one about a Philadelphia mint officer that had stolen 2.4 million dollars of the Presidential dollars that did not have the edge lettering and was selling them as errors. He was being convicted on theft and tax evasion. Another article talked about how the US Mint had clarified the ownership of error coins.

Dave gave a quick review of the past months' coin shows. He indicated that the Cheyenne show was disappointing. The Jefferson County show had light traffic. The West Slope show in Grand Junction was a good show and the Longmont/Boulder County show had a typical attendance.

He then reminded everyone of the upcoming coins shows.

Dave reviewed for everyone this months' Coin of the Month, Door Prize, and Raffle Prize.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes of the last meeting.

Dave We. gave the Treasurers report and stated we have \$2,623.43 in the club account. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers report. (Remember that any adult member may see the complete Treasurer's report by simply requesting to view it at the meeting.)

Dave thanked Gertrude K. and Stuart R. for bringing snacks.

Steve L. reported that he had the new Vicksburg quarters.

### Old Business

No updates on a new meeting location.

**DAVE F. needs programs!** Dave indicated that he needs help in coming up with programs for the club meetings. If you could do a program or know of someone who could do a program please contact Dave.

Dave F. related some changes to the discussion given by Bob at last months' meeting.

Dave talked about the Wooden Nickel to commemorate the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the NSCC. The club voted on the color of the printing and the final images and wording for the front and back of the nickel. The final selection was for Black printing with a Buffalo and the words Broomfield Colorado.

Dave thanked Stuart R. for implementing the requested club Web page changes.

### New Business

Dave reported that the club's Domain Name had been renewed.

Dave talked about the upcoming ANA show (May 2012) and how he would really like to have a NSCC presence at the Club Tables. He asked club members to think about if they would be able to help out in doing this.

Dave also reminded club members of the upcoming election, and to start thinking of who they would like to see run for the various positions.

### Last Months' "Show and Tell" Recap

Due to the length of the program only one show and tell was given.

Dave F. had some examples of coins that were used in the Jewish Lodz Ghetto in Poland in the early 1940s. These coins had the Jewish Star and the date (1943) on the obverse and indications of the number of Marks (5 & 10) they were worth on the reverse.

The program was given by club member, Don K., on the topic being “P-NCs: Collecting Coins with Stamps”. P-NC stands for Philatelic-Numismatic Combination. Don has collected stamps since age 6 but didn't start collecting coins until around 1960. Don said he was more interested in stamps and stamps were less expensive to acquire. When he became interested in coins he found that he enjoyed world coins due to the greater variety they presented. He then got interested in combining stamps with coins and began collecting these combinations that were put together by various companies. He then even created some of his own. These P-NCs typically have a theme which connects the subjects displayed on the stamp with the similar subject displayed on the coin.
