### **Minutes, Notes, and Happening of last months' meeting**

Last month's meeting was held on January 5<sup>th</sup>. We had 18 members along with some spouses and 1 guest attend our Pot Luck, which had been delayed one month from its' usual December date.

President Dave F. called the meeting to order at 7:05 and we immediately began eating. Dave resumed the meeting at 7:45.

We had one guest present. Colin had just moved up to Broomfield from Littleton and had heard about us through the South Suburban Coin Club. Colin collects US coins.

Member Rich M. signed up his 1 ½ year old son Carlos as a member of the club.

Dave reminded the club members that he had old copies of various coin magazines and papers to borrow.

Dave then passed on some news stories that he thought might be of interest. The first involved a metal detector find in England of approximately 4000 Roman coins. The next was the cost to purchase on of each thing that the US Mint had for sale in 2011. That cost was \$23,500. The last item concerned the mint looking into changing the cent and nickel coins to a composition of mainly steel.

Dave quickly reviewed the upcoming coin shows in the area and gave his opinion on the past shows results. He felt the last Aurora show had good attendance until the afternoon. The Ft. Collins show had good attendance despite the snow.

Dave reviewed the Door Prizes, Raffle, and Coin of the Month for this meeting.

Steve L. indicated that he had the 5<sup>th</sup> and final State Park Quarter, the Oklahoma Chickasaw. He also said that he still has Garfield Dollars.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes that were in the December and January Newsletters. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers reports that were in the December and January Newsletters. It was noted that the word Nickels was spelled incorrectly in the January Treasurers report. © We currently have \$2,571.33 in the club account. (Remember that any adult member may see the complete Treasurer's report by simply requesting to view it at the meeting.)

### **Old Business**

The NSCC Wooden Nickels are now available. It was determined by the Board that each renewing member will receive on free Nickel for renewing their membership. Additional nickels may be purchased for 50 cents each, up to a limit of 10 per day.

Dave F. indicated that he would like to try and get some club members to help man the Coin Clubs Table at the ANA Convention, May 10<sup>th</sup> thru 12<sup>th</sup>.

### **New Business**

The Election was held and Dave F. is still the President, Mark H. is still the Secretary and Steve L. won the election for the Director #2 positions. Congratulations to all.

### Last Months' Show and Tell Recap

Steve L. talked about his Presidents Synopsis that he had started when he was in Grade School. He has been adding more Presidents to it as a result of the Presidential Dollars program and has recently added a couple of more. Steve also showed off his recently completed 20<sup>th</sup> Century Type Set (excluding gold). He indicated that he had spent approximately \$150 in achieving his goal.

Dave F. showed off some currency that he had recently acquired. A portion of the collection was of currency from around the Civil War. He had examples of some Confederate Notes that he felt were authentic. He was sending them in to be authenticated and graded. He also had a Prisoner of War 2 cent note from an Alabama POW camp that held German prisoners during WWII. There was a 20 Teeohs note that was used during WWI in Germany by the US military for use at a circus and county fair that the military ran in Germany. Finally he also had obtained some Disney notes that could be used at Disneyland or Disneyworld.

Rich M. had an 1918-S Half Dollar that was from the Philippines but was minted at the San Francisco mint.

Don K. had 5 different pieces of Spanish Civil War paper money from 1938.
