RAFFLE PRIZE – This month's Raffle Prize will be the 2012 America the Beautiful Quarter Silver Proof set that the NSCC won as the second place prize in this year's ANA Trivia Challenge.

PROGRAM –The program this month will be "Three Unsung 19th Century Heroes Who Developed Denver and Colorado--Asa Clark, Milton Clark, and Emanuel Gruber--with Clark, Gruber & Co. Territorial Gold Coins" by Bob Bair.

COIN of the MONTH – Foreign Coin (NOT Canadian). (Note that this doesn't have to be a high grade coin, just a nice, no problems, coin that you, as a collector, would like to have).

[The "Coin of the Month" works as follows. Bring one coin, of the type described as the featured coin of the month, preferably in a 2x2 or flip. If you bring a coin, you will get a ticket in the drawing and your coin goes into the pot. We then draw one ticket and the winner gets the entire pot of coins that were featured.

FUN FACTS TRIVIA TOPIC – Washington Quarter.

We didn't get to this last month so we will try again with the same topic. Come up with one or more facts about the selected topic and bring them with you to the meeting. Minutes, Notes, and Happening of last months' meeting

Last month's meeting was held on June 7th. We had 25 members in attendance.

President Dave F., called the meeting to order at 7:02.

Dave asked if any guests were present. None were, but a new member who signed up at the ANA Money show was in attendance. Linda H. introduced herself and said that she had started collecting in her 20's and had gotten back into collecting when she recently acquired her parents collection.

Dave reminded the club members that he had old copies of various coin magazines and papers to borrow.

Dave then reviewed one news story that he thought might be of interest. The Canadian Royal Mint had started minting a new \$1 coin that had security features such as laser etching and letters that look different when viewed from different angles. Canada was also producing a new \$20 note that is polymer based and has clear windows on it.

Dave provided reviews of the previous months' coin shows. The Denver show was very busy and had some Dealers that don't typically attend this show. The ANA Money show will be discussed more later in the newsletter.

Dave quickly reviewed the upcoming coin shows in the area. The only upcoming show was the Colorado Springs show at the end of the month.

Dave reviewed the Door Prizes, Raffle, and Coin of the Month for this meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes that were in the Newsletter. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers report. We currently have \$2,797.23 in the club account.
