[The “Coin of the Month” works as follows. Bring one coin, of the type described as the featured coin of the month, preferably in a 2x2 or flip. If you bring a coin, you will get a ticket in the drawing and your coin goes into the pot. We then draw one ticket and the winner gets the entire pot of coins that were featured.

**SHOW and TELL** – Bring some interesting item from your collection that you would like to show the members and give a quick (1 minute) talk on.

**ANA NEWS** – The ANA received a donation of United States gold coins and Morgan silver dollars from the estate of Gerry Frederick Hansen that will significantly enhance the collection held by the American Numismatic Association's Edward C. Rochette Money Museum. The gold coin donations include 29 Double Eagles from 1900 to 1927; 24 Half Eagles dating from 1842 to 1926; two \$3 gold coins from 1854 and 1874; and four Quarter Eagles from 1852 to 1928. Of the 24 Half Eagles, 13 were minted at the long-defunct United States Mint branches in Charlotte, N.C., and Dahlonega, Ga

John Br. – Brought in a fantastic collection of all 4 Sheldon varieties of 1793 Chain Cents, which included the S1 “Ameri” cent. John spent considerable time describing how he obtain these. These were very nice examples of each variety and not the typical, almost worn smooth ones, you usually see if you are lucky enough to even find one.

Dave F. – Had a 1965 series of 3 Silver Statue of Liberty Centennial Medals.
