#### Minutes, Notes, and Happening of last months' meeting

Last month's meeting was held on Tuesday January 13<sup>th</sup>. We had 16 members in attendance along with a guest, Scott Twombly.

President Dave F. called the meeting to order at 7:04.

We had a guest, Scott Twombly, who collects 20<sup>th</sup> Century Type in PCGS Rattler holders. We also had a new member, Doug S. who likes to collect a variety of coins.

Dave had various coin magazines, papers, and Greysheets to borrow this month.

Dave reviewed a few interesting articles.

- -A metal detectorist in England found a hoard of 22,000 Roman coins. All of the coins were Bronze, mostly of Constantine I.
- -A man in California found a 70 oz. gold nugget while prospecting. It was handled by Kagins and sold in October for \$400,000.
- -The terrorist group ISIL said it plans on issuing its' own coins.
- -The Collectible Coin Protection Act was signed into law on Dec. 16, 2014. It now adds distributors to the list of entities that can be arrested for passing counterfeit coins. It also added trademark violations so that counterfeit slabs are now illegal. Dave wondered how this will be enforced.
- -A change in the Cuban policy may allow the trade of Cuban coins.
- -A time capsule buried by Sam Adams and Paul Revere was opened and contained 2 dozen coins including a 1652 Pine Tree Shilling.

Dave reported on upcoming Coin Shows. There were no past shows to review.

Dave reviewed the Door Prizes, Raffle, and Coin of the Month for this meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes that were in the January Newsletter.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers reports. We currently have \$2,960.60 in the club account. (Remember that any adult member may see the complete Treasurer's report by simply requesting to view it at the meeting.)

Dave F. talked about his attending the International Coin Show that is held in New York City, and features World and Ancient coins.

A big thanks to Linda H. who brought homemade Snickerdoodle cookies.

#### Old Business

Elections - Voting for new board members and officers was done. This year we only had one nomination for each open position so we just had a Vote of Affirmation. Dave Wi. was re-elected as Vice-President and Dave We. was re-elected Treasurer. Kent J. and Linda H. were also re-elected as Directors.

Dave reminded everyone that dues are now due.

#### **Program**

The program was "The Fabulous Kaufman Coin Collection" given by Bob Bair. Bob presented the history behind Louis Kaufman and his coin collection which had been created when he acquired the Nathan M. Kaufman collection from his brother upon his death in 1918 and combined it with his own and named it the Nathan M Kaufman collection. Much of Bob's presentation focused on the man, Louis Kaufman and all that he accomplished in his life, in and around Marquette Michigan. He built an elaborate Bank in Marquette and had special safes and display cases built into it, to display the fabulous collection. The collection had many fine pieces including Colonial coins, private territorial gold coins, Civil War tokens, and currency, but unfortunately many of them had been improperly cleaned over the decades.
