1. 1793 Chain Cent-Best Ever certified PCGS MS65 with some mint red color, Feb 11, 2016 By PCGS. **Story Summary:** With the third sale of a planned series of five, the D. Brent Pogue Collection sales, presented by Stack's Bowers Galleries in association with Sotheby's, became the most valuable series of numismatic auctions in history. Leading all lots, the Garrett MS65 RB (PCGS) 1793 Chain America cent, considered the finest surviving circulation strike Chain cent, brought \$998,750, surpassing its \$750,000 low estimate.

2. Canada Issues Kilogram Gold and Silver coins featuring Image of Rare Spirit Bear, Jan 29, 2016 by Coin Update. **Story Summary:** The Royal Canadian Mint has issued two one-kilo coins — one gold and one silver — which feature one of the Canada's most elusive and admired species of bear, the Spirit Bear. The design for the coins is a beautiful and detailed front-facing depiction of the Spirit Bear's face, with sparkling eyes enhanced with enamel. They will mint 500 of the silver coins (\$1,600 each) and 100 of the gold coins (\$69,000 each).

Canada Continues Geometry in Art Series with Digitally Depicted Polar Bear, Jan 25, 2016 by Coin Update. **Story Summary:** The Royal Canadian Mint has issued a new silver coin with a distinctive design of one of Canada's more popular and beloved subjects: the Polar Bear. The design takes a new approach combining familiarity and abstract design, blending together a mass of polygons to create a captivating image of a mother polar bear and her cub. Mintage is 7,500 and sells for 99.95 CAD.

Brand new Beatrix Potter coins to be released, Feb 29, 2016 by BBC. **Story Summary:** The Royal Mint are making a series of special coins to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the birth of Beatrix Potter. Beatrix Potter was a famous author who wrote children's stories about lots of different animals, like Peter Rabbit, Squirrel Nutkin and Mrs Tiggly-Winkle. 50 pence coin.

Perth Mint To Release 10 Kilo Year of the Monkey Silver Coin, Feb 11, 2016, Coin Update. **Story Summary:** The Perth Mint announced that it will soon be selling its 2016 Year of the Monkey 10 Kilo Silver Coin on a mint-to-order basis. The Mint's Web site notes that this item has a maximum mintage of 150 pieces. The reverse image depicts two monkeys sitting in a peach tree; peaches are a traditional symbol of longevity and immortality.

Modern Coin Profile – Austrian Mint 2016 Silver Niobium Coin “Time”, Jan 27, 2016, Coin Week. **Story Summary:** Dedicated to the history of chronometry, the latest ingenious addition to the Austrian Mint's best-selling two-tone silver niobium coins, 'Time' uses its two-tone niobium core and outer silver ring to show a selection of timepieces throughout the ages. A watch face, sun, moon, hourglass, and watch mechanism are all featured on the coin.

More U.S. Mint packaging mistakes delaying releases of 2016 products, Jan 20, 2016, Coin World. **Story Summary:** Thousands of boxes for the Proof 2016-S America the Beautiful quarters set have to be scrapped because the image second from left representing the Cumberland National Historical Park actually depicts Cumberland Falls State Resort Park and not the national park. Affected are the five-coin 2016-S America the Beautiful Quarter Proof set, and the 12-coin 2016-S Proof and 2016-S Silver Proof sets. 12,000 of the sets with the printing error on the box were shipped to the customers who ordered them before sales were suspended. Spike in prices because of this? 33% premium now.
