Program

The program this month was The “World’s first Mint Colored Coin” by Bob C.

Palau, a small Pacific island, was the 1st “country” to make a colored coin. To be recognized as a coin, the place it was minted must be recognized as a country by the United Nations. This occurred in 1994 for Palau. Also a coin must have a value assigned to it and be authorized by the country. The color must be put on at the mint or by someone authorized by the mint to do so. Palau made colored coins before 1994 but because they were not an official country until 1994, they are not recognized as the first country to make colored coins. In 1993 Uganda and Equatorial Guinea put out colored coins.

News Items

1. New at the Mint: 2016 Presidential Dollar Proof Set, Feb 16, 2016 by Coin Update. **Story Summary:** The U.S. Mint has released the 2016 Presidential One Dollar Coin Proof Set containing Proof versions of this year's three Presidential dollars. The set costs \$17.95 and has no stated limits on production or orders per household. This year's Presidential dollars have obverse designs honoring Richard M. Nixon, Gerald R. Ford, and Ronald Reagan, the final three presidents eligible for this series, which will conclude after this year.

2. New Members Join Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee, Feb 17, 2016 by Coin Update. **Story Summary:** Dennis Tucker (publisher at Whitman Publishing) takes over for outgoing member Dr. Michael Bugeja to fill a position created for individuals "specially qualified in numismatics." Steve Roach (editor-at-large for Coin World) will occupy a seat designated for a "representative of the general public," formerly held by Gary Marks.

3. US Cent and Nickel Costs Trending Lower, Feb 19, 2016 by CoinNews.net. **Story Summary:** The cost of producing U.S. circulating coins fell for a fourth straight year, the United States Mint disclosed in its 2015 Annual Report. For the Mint's fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, the total unit cost to produce, administer and distribute the cent was 1.43 cents compared to 1.66 cents in 2014. Similarly, the nickel's costs totaled 7.44 cents versus 8.09 cent from a year earlier.

4. Federal Judge Sentences Coin, Precious Metals Dealer Hannes Tulving in \$15 Million Fraud Case, Feb 22, 2016 by COINWeek. **Story Summary:** A coin and precious metals dealer and his company responsible for defrauding more than 380 customers of over \$15 million were sentenced in federal court late Wednesday, February 17, 2016. Hannes Tulving, Jr., 60, of Newport Beach, California was sentenced to 30 months in prison and three years of supervised release. The company was ordered to pay a \$10 million fine and was placed on a probationary period of two years. Tulving and his company executed a scheme to defraud customers nationwide by inducing them to place orders for coins and other merchandise knowing those orders could not be fulfilled.

5. 2016 \$20 Batman v Superman Silver Coin for \$20, Feb 22, 2016, CoinNews.net. **Story Summary:** The Royal Canadian Mint is accepting orders for the 2016 \$20 Batman v Superman: Dawn of Justice™ Silver Coin, the latest issue from its popular series of 99.99% pure silver coins that sell at their legal tender face values. Most of these issues have sold out.

Austria's 2016 "Time" Silver Niobium Coin, Feb 16, 2016, World Mint News Blog. **Story Summary:** Austria has announced that its upcoming "Time" Silver Niobium Coin, composed of 9 grams of 90% silver and 6.5 grams of 99.8% niobium, will be released on March 9. The coin's 65,000-piece mintage has already been pre-ordered, however, effectively rendering the issue sold out before it has even been released. Priced at €69.60, the coin is sure to see interest on the secondary market, where pre-sales are currently averaging around \$100 USD. Exactly what Terry K told us last month.

Boardwalk For \$5,000—Cashless: Monopoly Enters a New Era, Feb 19, 2016, Coin Update. **Story Summary:** One of the best-selling board games of all time made headline news when it was announced that a new version of Monopoly will no longer use cash as a part of its play. This new edition of Monopoly,

dubbed “Ultimate Banking” by Hasbro, will no longer have paper bills in varying denominations, and will instead have a banking card for each player and a handheld card reader. No more Free Parking. ☺

Official - 2016 Gold Centennial Coins to be SMALLER!, Mar 12, 2016, Coin Talk Forum. **Story Summary:** Coin World has reported that the soon to be released Centennial Mercury/Winged Liberty dime will NOT BE THE DIAMETER OF ITS DESIGN INSPIRATION. Coin World has stated the diameter at 16.5mm, the exact size of the current 1/10 ounce Gold Eagle, and NOT the diameter of the original Mercury/Winged Liberty Dime, which is 17.9mm.

9. Poland Commemorates WWII Paratroopers with 10 Zloty Silver Coin, Feb 29, 2016, by CoinWeek.

Heritage to Auction Reiner Hoard of GSA Morgan Dollars at Dallas Money Show, Mar 3, 2016, CoinWeek. **Story Summary:** The March 3-6 Dallas ANA Signature auction features Selections from The Lenny Reiner Collection, Part III, an outstanding collection consisting entirely of GSA Morgan dollars. Highlights from this collection in the auction include some high graded 1879-CC, 1880-CC, 1881-CC, and 1885-CC GSA Morgan Dollars along with some VAM varieties. There were a total of 1,050 GSA Dollars in this auction.

NGC slabs regulated gold, Feb 29, 2016, Numismatic News. **Story Summary:** The Numismatic Guaranty Corporation reports it certified six rare early American regulated gold pieces that were submitted during the New York International Numismatic Convention. Regulated gold coins represent an important era in United States coin circulation history. Five of the submitted coins bear the hallmark of Ephraim Brasher, a famous gold and silversmith. He is well known for producing the Brasher doubloon, the first gold coin minted for the United States.

PCGS: Analysis Confirms Two More Virtually Pure Copper Judd-2 1792 Pattern Cents, Feb 27, 2016, CoinWeek. **Story Summary:** PCGS recently had the unique opportunity to perform metallurgical testing on two different examples of the extremely rare 1792 Pattern Cent. Both were shown to have been made of essentially pure copper instead of a “fusible alloy” containing copper and a small portion of silver.
