Dave We. had taken the Advanced Grading with Problem coins class, and president Bob C. had taken the photography class first week and Beginning Grading second week.

Bob then reported on upcoming Coin Shows.

Bob indicated that he had heard that there was going to be a new coin store opening up in Broomfield. He got this information from the person opening the store who was in Bob's Photography class.

Bob also indicated that he had attended the CCAC meeting held one evening during summer seminar and saw how they went about deciding on what coin designs would be used on future mint releases.
