### Northside Coin Club Meeting September 13, 2016

#### **News Items**

- 1. The next couple of months are a busy season for coin shows. We just had a show in Cheyenne last weekend with shows in Golden, Longmont, and Denver just around the corner. We should be able to get our coin show fix under our belts before winter sets in.
- 2. I look forward to hearing everyone's experience in buying (or trying to buy) the Standing Liberty 2016 Centennial Gold Coin last Thursday. I heard that people who tried to order their coin when the mint started taking their orders at 10:00 am, had problems completing their order. I ordered my coin at 2:00 pm and had no problems doing so. I checked the mint's web page Friday morning and there were still gold coins available. Was the \$485 price tag too high? Was the household order limit of 1 a good way to go? Are these reasons why these coins didn't sell out in hours after opening sales?
- 3. Did you hear about the 1964 Morgan Dollar dies that were found at the Philadelphia mint? August 30, 2016 by Coin World. Story Summary: Whitman Publishing announced last month that they would be coming out with a new 5<sup>th</sup> edition of their Guide Book (red book) of Morgan Silver Dollars September 27, 2016. This edition will contain information on the previously unknown 1964 Morgan dollar. John Dannreuther, Dennis Tucker, Q. David Bowers and David Sundman, were at the Philadelphia mint in July of 2015 on a research mission that included a look at the Mint's archives. Dannereuther was going through a cabinet of trays with various tooling for a variety of Mint products when he noticed obverse and reverse galvanos for the Morgan dollar; Tucker joined him to look at them when they both noticed at the same time that the obverse was dated 1964. Much excitement followed, and they were granted entrance to the vault for dies and hubs, where additional tooling was found. No coins were found and uncertainty remains as to whether any working dies or trial strikes were made. Obverse and reverse models for the 1964 Peace dollar were found as well, plus hubs and master dies for that coin, which we know were struck.

4. Australian man unearths 145-ounce gold nugget found using metal detector. August 24, 2016 by Coin World. Story Summary: An Australian man who has spent his weekends the past 10 years prospecting for gold with a metal detector has unearthed a 145-ounce gold nugget valued at \$250,000 AUD (\$190,282 in U.S. funds). The discovery was announced Aug. 25 by Minelab, the metal-detecting equipment manufacturer whose flagship GPZ 7000 model metal detector was used to locate the nugget. The unnamed prospector, who wishes to remain anonymous, dubbed his find "Friday's Joy" after it was recently located in the far southern edge of Central Victoria's Golden Triangle in Australia.

Story Summary: A Modesto, Calif., man discovered an 18-ounce gold nugget in a river about 60 miles outside of Stockton, Calif., last week. Oscar Espinoza reported the find to a friend on the afternoon of Aug. 30. It may not be 145 ounces, but it's still quite a find.

Carmichael was a major Canadian artist. Whatever the power of his art, he will long be remembered for a simple scene of nature: a solitary Common Loon swimming on a lake. There have been one billion Loonies struck since 1987.
