Program

The program for the month was “American Indians on US Coins and Currency” by Bob Bair.

Bob started out with some historical perspective. He discussed how Native Americans were viewed back in the 1700 and 1800s. At first they were written about as great or noble people. Then they were viewed as evil and savages. There was a period when it was felt that we should try and assimilate them. Then there were periods when we wanted to remove or eliminate them. Finally we began to “Romanticize” them as vanished Americans.

He then moved into the various coins and bills that had images on them. Which ones were symbolic forms of liberty and which ones were accurate depictions.

News Items

1. **CCAC twice favors turtle designs for America the Beautiful quarter dollars** October 1, 2016 by Coin World **Story Summary:** Turtle designs were the overwhelming favorite coin design by the Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee for the America the Beautiful quarter dollars each of the past two years. The Commission of Fine Arts did not recommend the turtle design for the Ozark National Scenic Riverways quarter. Instead, it selected a design that included Alley Mill, a steel roller mill built in 1894. On Sept. 1, 2016, the U.S. Mint unveiled the final designs for their 2017 America the Beautiful quarters and they chose the Alley Mill design.

The CCAC made its selections for the 2018 ATB quarter designs at a June 27, 2016, meeting. Members said the Cumberland Island National Seashore quarter dollar was one of the best they had seen for the quarter series. This design showed a loggerhead sea turtle swimming along the undeveloped beach of Cumberland Island. The CFA did not recommend the turtle design (again) for the Cumberland Island quarter. Instead, members selected a design that included a snowy egret ready for flight.

2. **2016 "30th Anniversary" American Eagle One-Ounce Silver Proof Coin** September 16, 2016 by Mint News Blog. **Story Summary:** The U.S. Mint released the 2016 American Eagle One-Ounce Silver Proof Coin. This year's Proof Silver Eagle is a special anniversary issue that celebrates 30 years of the American Eagle bullion coin program, launched in 1986. For this year's 30th anniversary design, the Mint has altered the edge of the coins from their usual reeded pattern to a smooth surface that features 30th ANNIVERSARY incused near the date.

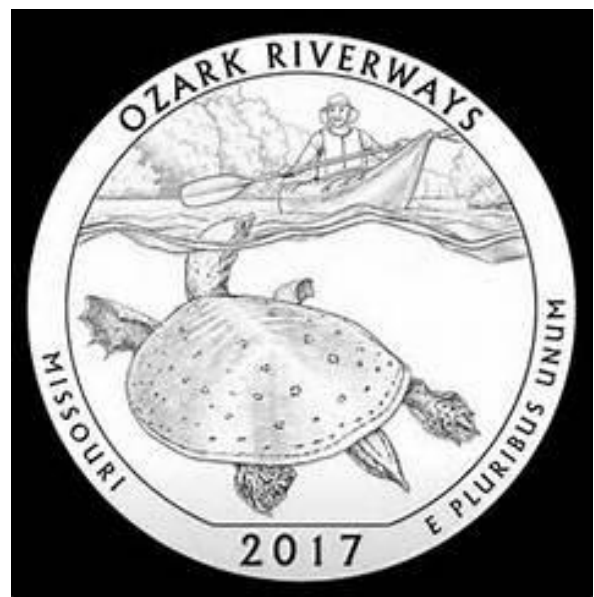
