#### Program

The program for the month was "ANACS Update" by Paul DeFelice. Paul introduced himself and told the club a little about himself. He has been with ANACS since 2008, and before that, was with ICG from 2005-2008 when they were located in Colorado.

Paul then talked about ANACS newest service. Encapsulating and grading Double Mint Sets. ANACS works with another company OSV, who verifies that the mint sets are original, and then ANACS grades each coin and encapsulates them in special Mint Set holders with a "Set Grade". Individual coin grades are available at the ANACS website, but the Set Grade is a composite grade using a patented formula. Paul also indicated that ANACS uses 4 graders in Colorado, including J.P. Martin and Michael Fahey, to grade all coins except they have two additional graders for Bulk grading. They also use John Roberts, out of Ohio, for attributions.

#### Northside Coin Club Meeting October 11, 2016

#### **News Items**

1. PCGS Advice Not Followed, February 8, 2016 by Coin World. Story Summary: On the eve of PCGS's 30th anniversary, co-founder David Hall recalls that, in the early days of planning the company, he was advised not to do it. There was early consideration about making PCGS a nonprofit organization. "We thought we would receive and examine about 3,000 coins a month, and we planned our operations accordingly. But 18,000 coins were submitted during the first month. The second month 35,000 coins were submitted. Within nine months submissions were over 100,000 coins a month," he recalled.

"About a year after we started, the backlog for regular service had a 10 month wait. You sent in your coins and got them back in 10 months. We had an express service at the time and everyone marked their express orders with an 'X' on the box so we would open those orders first. At one point we couldn't even open all the boxes we were receiving and we stored the non-express orders unopened, off premise with Loomis [an armored transport and cash storage company]," Hall said.

"We had a 30-day backlog in just opening the boxes we received. Since we required payment in advance, every one of those boxes had a check made out to us, but we couldn't even open the boxes to put the checks in the bank."


