The monthly Northside Coin Club meeting will be held on Tuesday December 13<sup>th</sup>, 2016 at 7 PM (doors open at 6:30) at the **Cross of Christ Lutheran Church** in Broomfield, see our web site [www.northsidecoinclub.org](http://www.northsidecoinclub.org) for directions. The church is located on the corner of Lowell Blvd and 121<sup>st</sup> Place, just a couple of blocks east of our old meeting site. When you turn off of 120<sup>th</sup> onto Perry, as if you were going to the old location, just take the first right onto 121<sup>st</sup> Place and go a couple of blocks until just before you get to Lowell Blvd. The Church will be on your right. Turn into the parking lot before you get to the church buildings.

**RAFFLE PRIZE** – This month's Raffle Prize is a 1943 Lincoln Cent graded MS-65 by ICG.
