Program

The program was on "Paper Money Production, Errors and What You Can Look For In Circulation", by Dave Heim. Dave talked about how looking through you currency could make you some money. He discussed "*" or star notes, notes with unique types of serial numbers such as RADAR notes (12344321), ladder notes (12345678 or 98765432), solid (22222222), repeater (23452345), super repeaters (45454545), and low and high (00000100 or 99999927). He also talked about notes with printing errors such as serial numbers on the back, missing seals, and folded notes. He also talked about the ultimate type of errors, mixed denominations. This would be something like a one dollar bill on one side and a five on the other.

1. 1794 Liberty Cap, Starred Reverse cent with 'speck of light green crud' still realizes over \$44,000, June 26, 2017 by Coin World. Story Summary: The 1794 Liberty Cap, Starred Reverse cent is one of the most enigmatic productions of the early Philadelphia Mint. There are 94 tiny five-pointed stars between — and at times under — the dentils on the reverse. Nearly all of the tiny stars are still visible and the Goldberg cataloger wrote, "It appears it has never been brushed or 'conserved' in any way."

2. The world's most valuable Bicentennial Quarter was recently offered at the FUN show summer convention, June 22, 2017 by Coin World. Story Summary: The killer combination of a wrong planchet and a one-year design type make an error coin offered in Heritage's auction at the Florida United Numismatists' summer convention a visually striking piece. The piece is a 1776–1976-D Washington, Bicentennial quarter dollar struck on a cent planchet. The coin retains some of its Mint red color, being graded Mint State 67 red and brown by Numismatic Guaranty Corp.

3. NGC Signs Charlie Duke, Astronaut Who Walked on Moon, to Autograph Labels, June 26, 2017 by CoinWeek. Story Summary: Duke is one of only 12 people to have walked on the surface of the moon. As part of the Apollo 16 mission, Duke became the 10th man to walk on the moon in April 1972. Then 36 years old, he became the youngest person ever to have stepped foot on the lunar surface — a record that he still holds. A picture that accompanied the article showed his signature on a holder containing a 1972 S Silver Eisenhower Dollar in MS 68 condition. NGC Charlie Duke Authentic Hand-Signed Labels will be available from select retailers later this year.

Another CoinWeek story talked about Pawn Star Rick Harrison was also signed by NGC to autograph a limited number of NGC certification labels.
