1. Jim Thorpe dominates reverse design for 2018 Native American dollar, December 21, 2017 by Coin World. Story Summary: The United States Mint officially announced the reverse (tails) design of the 2018 Native American \$1 coin. The coin's theme pays homage to sports legend Jim Thorpe. The 2018 reverse design depicts Jim Thorpe, with the foreground elements highlighting his football and Olympic achievements. Inscriptions are JIM THORPE, WA-THO-HUK (Thorpe's Sac and Fox tribe name), UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, and \$1.

2. Your first look at the Treasury secretary's signature on new notes, November 28, 2017 by Coin World. Story Summary: Steven T. Mnuchin prints his signature rather than using cursive, improving legibility. The first Series 2017 \$1 Federal Reserve notes with the signatures of the new Treasury secretary, Steven T. Mnuchin, and new United States Treasurer Jovita Carranza were unveiled at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing on Nov. 15. The debut of the note was widely covered on the Internet, cable news, and social media, mainly owing to a series of photos showing the secretary and his wife holding a 50-subject sheet of Atlanta district star notes.

3. **Mnuchin: 'I didn't realize' viral dollar bill photo would go public,** November 19, 2017 by Politico. **Story Summary:** Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin explained Sunday why he and his wife, Louise Linton, struck a villainous pose with a sheet of dollar bills: He didn't think the pictures would be public. An Associated Press photographer captured Mnuchin and Linton posing with the sheet of dollar bills — the first to include Mnuchin's signature — at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing last week.

4. **Star Wars: The Last Jedi** — **and the coins to match,** December 19, 2017 by World Mint News Blog. **Story Summary:** Friday, December 15, 2017, Star Wars: The Last Jedi opened in theaters and scored the second largest opening in sales ever, only to be outdone by the previous installment, The Force Awakens, which was released two years prior. While the New Zealand Mint features a variety of Star Wars–themed coinage on their website, it appears that the island of Niue has issued three coins specifically designed around characters in The Last Jedi. Each coin contains one troy ounce of .999 fine silver and possesses a limited mintage of 10,000 units each. The first coin's reverse features Luke Skywalker, the second coin's reverse features Chewbacca, and the third coin features film antagonist Supreme Leader Snoke flanked by Kylo Ren.
