Terry provided some Coin News items;

At the FUN Show an 1892 CC Morgan dollar in a GSA holder graded XF40 by NGC was displayed. This is the only know coin of this date and mintmark in a GSA holder. Also a 1943 Bronze Cent in 63 RD topped \$1,000,000. There is a new Star Trek 10oz silver Enterprise 3D model. The mint may be looking at another State Quarter program. Terry also talked about a Mule note from 1899 with a \$1/\$2. NGC just came out with a site that lists the 50 most counterfeited coins.

1. **GreatCollections auctions 1970-D Kennedy half dollar, one of few in top grade,** March 6, 2018 by Coin World. **Story Summary:** One of just 14 1970-D Kennedy half dollars graded PCGS MS-67 brought competition from 14 bidders, realizing \$4,443.75 at auction Feb. 4. Collectors continue to gravitate toward top-graded coins for inclusion in the Professional Coin Grading Service and Numismatic Guaranty Corp. Registry Set programs.

2. **2018 Breast Cancer Awareness Commemorative coins on sale March 15,** March 2, 2018 by Coin World. **Story Summary:** Collectors will have their first opportunity to place orders for the 2018 Breast Cancer Awareness Commemorative coins at noon Eastern Time March 15. The product options include the nation's first pink gold coin. The gold \$5 coin is limited to an overall release of 50,000 coins in Proof and Uncirculated versions. Combined production of the silver dollar in Proof and Uncirculated versions is limited to 400,000 coins, while the copper-nickel clad half dollar's maximum authorized limit is 750,000 coins.

Seated Liberty Coins were produced from 1837 thru 1891, a total of 55 years, and included Half Dimes, Dimes, Twenty Cent Pieces, Quarters, Halves, and Dollars. Twenty Cent Pieces were produced for the shortest period, 1875 thru 1878, while Dimes were produced for the full period of 1837 to 1891.
