News Items

1. In light of excessive returns, U.S. Mint introduces new policy Sanctions could be imposed for customers repeatedly exceeding 2 percent return rate, March 16 and 23, 2018 by Coin World. **Story Summary:** For more than a decade, the Mint has offered a return privilege for customers to return numismatic products for exchange or refund for any reason within a seven-day window. The Mint absorbed the shipping costs for returning the items. Effective immediately, the Mint reserves the right to limit or refuse returns from purchasers who demonstrate return rates that exceed two percent. This update does not apply to valid issues of product quality.

2. ‘Legendary’ 1955 Lincoln, Doubled Die Obverse cent turns heads at Rarities Night, April 3, 2018 by Coin World. **Story Summary:** A 1955 Lincoln, Doubled Die Obverse cent graded PCGS MS-65+ with a green CAC sticker sold for a massive \$114,000 at Stack’s Bowers’ March 22 Rarities Night auction.

3. Kareem Abdul-Jabbar to Step Down from Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee, April 5, 2018 by US Mint. **Story Summary:** Mr. Kareem Abdul-Jabbar has informed the Acting Deputy Director of the United States Mint that he intends to step down from the Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee (CCAC)

due to increasing personal obligations. He was appointed to the CCAC in January 2017 as a member representing the interests of the general public. Abdul-Jabbar is a renowned former professional basketball player who is an avid coin collector. He became interested in numismatics through his love of history and his study of Alexander Hamilton. Abdul-Jabbar has agreed to remain on the CCAC until a successor is appointed.

4. **Mule error brings \$192,000**, April 6, 2018 by Numismatic News. **Story Summary:** A record price of \$192,000 was achieved in March by an error coin with a Sacagawea dollar reverse paired with a Washington quarter obverse struck on a golden dollar planchet. This sort of error is called a mule, as the obverse and reverse dies are mismatched.

5. **NCIC Tip Leads to Arrests in the Rob Gronkowski Break-in During Super Bowl**, March 30, 2018 by CoinNews.net. **Story Summary:** While New England Patriots tight end Rob Gronkowski was busy playing in Super Bowl LII on Feb. 5, suspects were busy burglarizing his home, which he shared with three other individuals. The suspects stole safes, guns and jewelry, as well as two proof Morgan dollars. The Numismatic Crime Information Center (NCIC) shared a tip obtained from an email from the New England Coin Exchange, who advised a high-profile client had been the recent victim of a burglary. He provided the certification numbers on the two coins and within 30 minutes of sending out the alert, they received a call from a dealer from Massachusetts, who advised he had the coins and the identity of the person who sold them.
