News Items

1. **First of its kind, rare note from 1966 could hit six figures in Lyn Knight auction**, May 26, 2018 by Coin World. **Story Summary:** First of its kind: Series 1966 \$100 United States note bearing serial number 1. If there is such a thing as a “King of Small Size Number 1 Notes,” lot 19825 in the Lyn Knight Auction U.S. Paper Money Sale on June 8 is a leading contender. Its first appearance on the market since 2004 comes with a starting price of \$90,000 and a minimum estimate of \$150,000. It is graded by the cataloger as Very Choice Crisp Uncirculated.

2. **New Greysheet**, April 16, 2018 by Coin World. **Story Summary:** The final edition of the Weekly Greysheet was published in April 27, 2018. The old Greysheet, Bluesheet, Goldsheet, Monthly Supplement, Quarterly I, Quarterly II, and Quarterly III are now all combined in the Monthly Greysheet in line with Bluesheet values. This new publication in printed format is like a newspaper. It is difficult to copy because of the page size. I recommend people go to a digital subscription. First May issue was 96 pages long. Without the ad pages, it's 75 pages long. Full text search is available in this PDF document. Up and down colored triangles show changes in pricing for coins.

3. **U.S. medals and tokens featured in new MEGA RED, 4th Edition**, May 29, 2018 by MintNewsBlog. **Story Summary:** Collectors of exnumia (tokens, medals, and similar coin-like objects) will enjoy more than 50 pages devoted to their interests in the fourth edition of MEGA RED (the Deluxe Edition of the Guide Book of United States Coins). Eight of the book's twenty-five appendices feature American exnumia ranging from dime-sized tokens to dollar-sized and larger medals. The 1,504-page MEGA RED is available from booksellers and hobby shops nationwide, as well as online (including at the publisher's website). It retails for \$49.95.

The 1939 Jefferson Nickel has two different reverses, the reverse of 1938 and the reverse of 1940. During 1939 the US Mint modified the steps of Monticello to strengthen them and to make them straighter and more defined. Both reverses can be found on coins dated 1939 but the reverse of 1938 seems to be more rare.
