Terry K. – Had a 1933 Indonesia coin that he thought was valuable due to an error in the Krause book. The book stated 1933 had 2 varieties, one which was valuable. Terry thought his coin was the valuable variety but it turns out that the 1932 coin is the one with 2 varieties, and the 1933 coin is like the valuable variety of 1932.

Dave We. – Had first shot at some new coins Rick Snow had just acquired at the Summer ANA. Picked up a nice RED one graded MS64. Also picked up a Liberty Dollar. These were basically silver rounds but looked similar to US coins. These were created by Bernard von NotHaus. He, and others involved with him, were charged with federal crimes for making coins similar to US coins.

Bob C. – Had a silver 1000 Yen commemorative coin with a Turtle on it. Also had a 1965 SMS Kennedy Half graded MS67 Cameo by NGC.

The program was a "The Story of the Transition to the Small Cent" by club member John B. John's presentation began with coins in 1856 when the US decided to go away from the Large copper cents and begin producing smaller cents initially made from Copper-Nickel. He talked about the Flying Eagle cents and then the new Indian Head cents, showing the various types that were produced and presented nice examples from his own collection including some patterns. He continued on through the Lincoln cents mentioning the 1943 Steel cents and the transition to the Memorial cents and finally the copper plated zinc cents.

News Items

1. Have questions about the BEP decision to close its online store?, September 24, 2018 by Coin World. Story Summary: The BEP has closed its online store and will be selling its products online exclusively through the U.S. Mint website. Officials have answers, advice for customers on establishing new accounts with Mint website. There is a Currency link next to the Shop Coins link. The 4 categories under the Currency link are Premium Products, Lucky Money Collection, Uncut Currency, and Engravings. The 6 products under Premium Products range in price between \$21.95 to \$149.95. The 4 products under Lucky Money Collection were all under \$25 and contained bills in special envelopes, some with special serial numbers. The 21 producets under Uncut Currency were uncut currency sheets of \$1, \$2, \$10, \$20, \$50, and \$100 notes. The 91 products under Engravings were intaglio prints and souvenir cards of presidents, national monuments, and more.

2. **DeCRON Club to release coins struck from space-flown bullion,** September 19, 2018 by Coin World. **Story Summary:** The Mint of Poland, Mennica Polska, is being contracted to strike coins from space-flown gold, silver, platinum and copper. The bullion pieces are being struck in Proof in .999 fine silver, .999 fine gold and .999 fine platinum, and in silver with an Antique Finish. Each 37-millimeter, reeded edge coin will contain 1 ounce of the respective precious metal. At most, 10,000 coins each will be issued of the Proof and Antique Finish silver versions, as well as 1,000 in gold and 100 in platinum. The first coins in a planned five-coin series are being issued in October to honor American astronaut Alan Shepard's 1961 suborbital flight aboard the Freedom 7 spacecraft. The letter S symbolizes Shepard's surname as well as the beginning of the SPACE coin set, in which each letter of "space" will be assigned to an individual coin release. The motto IN SPACE WE TRUST appears as part of the inscriptions.

Pre-order pricing is \$399 for the silver versions, \$3,999 for the gold coin and \$4,999 for the platinum coin.

The remaining coins planned in the series are:

- P: Proton, the rocket carrying the first International Space Station's module to Earth's orbit in 1998.
- A: Armstrong, Neil, and Apollo 11. The first man on the Moon in July 1969.
- C: Columbia, the first space shuttle in the Space Transportation System, in 1981.
- E: Elon Musk, the man who designed the heavy-lift launch vehicle Falcon 9 and landed booster back.

Story Summary: For the 100th anniversary of the death of cutlery pioneer Karl Elsener, the Swissmint will launch the "Swiss Army Knife" silver coin on 10 September 2018. Swissmint will conclude this year's coin program with the new commemorative coin for coin enthusiasts and collectors and the 2018 Christmas Coin Set.

Interesting Coin Facts

The Lincoln cent has had 7 different major reverses since first being minted in 1909. The original Wheat Ears reverse was used from 1909 until 1958. In 1959 the Memorial reverse was first used, commemorating the 150 anniversary of Lincoln's birth. It was used through 2008. In 2009, four different reverses were used to commemorate the bicentennial of Lincoln's birth. These four reverses depicted various times in Lincoln's life. In 2010 the current, Shield, reverse began to be used.
