Jim T., a friend and neighbor of member Dave F. joined the club as did Randy G., who had visited NSCC a couple of times in the last few months.

The meeting was called to order by President Bob C. at 7:04.

There were a couple of Numismatist magazines and some Coin Worlds available to take or borrow.

Bob talked about the Sea Turtle Symposium that he had attended and the various numismatic items that he was selling there.

Bob went through his President's Notes section listed in the Newsletter.

There were no recent Coin Shows to comment on.

Bob then reviewed the Raffle, Door Prize, and Coin of the Month.

Bob reminded everyone that he has the Krause Catalog on Thumb Drives available to the members to borrow.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes that were in the Newsletter.

New Business

NSCC had received a letter from Don Kagin, who is running for ANA President. He wanted to get the support of NSCC via a club nomination for ANA President. The club members voted to do this, so Bob C. and Mark H. signed the nomination form and Mark H. saw to it that it was mailed back to the ANA.

Last Months' Show and Tell Recap

Michael S. – While in Japan visited the Bank of Japan Currency Museum. Said the exhibits were very well done. He had examples of nice handouts that the museum provided that were in both Japanese and English that showed all of the valid coins and notes being produced.

Dave F. – Had a gold ancient Greek Coin that NGC had graded with the "Fine Style" designation. This meant that the die cutter had done an excellent job in creating the dies so that the coins they produced had great details.

Bob C. – Had a \$5 gold Apollo 11 coin. Also had examples of 1979 Susan B Anthony dollars, one a wide rim variety and one a close rim variety. These indicate how close the date is to the rim. The wide rim variety is rarer.

John D'A – Had a picture of the Pony Express with a bunch of Mercury dimes mounted along both sides of the picture. John had no idea why Mercury dimes were with the picture or what the connection was.

Many of these were minted by the various states including Vermont, New Jersey, Massachusetts, and Connecticut. Some of these coins were foreign from countries such as Spain (Spanish milled dollars, also known as “piece of eight”), France, and England.

In 1793, the first year the US Mint produced coins that were actually used by the citizens of the US for commerce, only Half Cents and Cents were produced. In 1794 Half Dollars, and Silver Dollars were also minted though in very small numbers. There were also a few half Disme coins dated 1794 but they were actually produced in 1795.
