The program was “A First Year Type Set of US Coins of the 20th Century” by club member Terry K. Terry talked about his 20<sup>th</sup> Century Type set and how he wanted his type set to be defined as having the first year of issue for each coin rather than any date during the series. This makes the set a more expensive set as many first year issues have lower mintages. He made an exception in a few cases, such as the 1916 Standing Liberty Quarter, which are very expensive even in low grades. All photos in Terry’s presentation were of his type set coins. His type set included all issues including US gold.

4. **1856-S Seated Liberty dime in SS Central America treasure haul**, June 14, 2019, Coin World. **Story Summary:** An 1856-S Seated Liberty dime that survived 157 years under the ocean among the remains of the SS Central America is now graded and encapsulated by Professional Coin Grading Service and tied with another similar piece for the finest known example at MS65. Two purser's bags recovered from the ship purser's iron lock box amid the SS Central America remains "contained a combined total of \$1,588.95 face value of U.S. coins from silver dimes to half eagle \$5 gold coins, and ranged in dates from 1796 to 1857."

## Interesting Coin Facts

The 1909-S VDB Lincoln cent is heavily counterfeited. But there are many diagnostics to help identify a real one. The S mint mark will have parallel vertical serifs. There is also a die chip at the back of the upper loop of the S. There were only 4 Obverse dies used to mint this coin and the positions of the mint mark are well documented. Finally the B in the VDB on the reverse will have a slight slant on the central crossbar.
