3. **AgAuNEWS email Germania Mint adds Germania Beasts to it's range and kicks off with the treasure hoarding dragon, Fafnir, July 3, 2020. Story Summary:** It was less than two years ago that the fledgling Germania Mint burst onto the scene with its pretty Germania bullion round, and it wasn't long after they moved into the numismatic realm with some fine proof and plated coins. The dragon coin itself is a beauty, especially the 25,000 mintage one-ounce silver bullion round. There are also two variants. The first, called Germinus, is a twin-pack of 1 oz rounds, one finished with a gilded dragon and ruthenium/palladium plating, the other with a reverse of that. 500 sets will be produced. The second special is one employing a new finish called Chameleon, similar to the effect some automotive paints have, that 'shimmers' when moved. In addition, this one doubles up at 2oz in weight and has some impressive levels of high-relief. They will make 999 pieces beautifully presented in a themed acrylic frame with a pedestal

4. **AgAuNEWS email Music Legends from the Royal Mint follows legendary band 'Queen' with the equally iconic Rocketman, Elton John, July 6, 2020. Story Summary:** It was in January that the Royal Mint surprised us all with the debut of its new 'Music Legends' range. The Queen coin appears to have been extremely popular, and Elton John has a similarly broad fanbase. The coin is a superb tribute to this esoteric

character, capturing his image as it was at his peak, combining musical notation, the British flag, and his iconic bow tie and hat. The range is big, with gold variants going from ¼oz up to a kilo, and silver from ½oz to 5oz.

A new die marriage of the 1795 Flowing Hair Half Dollar has been verified by PCGS. The new marriage was struck with a previously unknown Obverse die that will now be known as the Overton 133 variety. This is the first new major die variety to be discovered for the 1795 Half Dollar in more than 90 years.
