<u>ANA NEWS</u> – The ANA donated \$55,000 to the Anti-Counterfeiting Educational Foundation (ACEF), an organization that received contributions to fund the work of the Industry Council for Tangible Assets' Anti-Counterfeiting Task Force (ACFT). ACTF's mission is to mobilize law enforcement to protect the integrity of U.S. coinage by educating officials about the growing threat that counterfeit circulating, collectible and bullion coins pose to the collecting community and the public and moving them to act.

News Items

1. **Proof 70 Grades are Elusive for Set Coins,** September 17, 2018 by Coin World. **Story Summary:** Most Silver Reverse Proof coins are being graded Proof 69. One buyer was willing to pay \$1,500 Aug 17 on eBay under a Buy it Now option for a 2018-S Block Island National Wildlife Refuge silver quarter dollar graded Proof 70 by PCGS. Graders at PCGS, NGC and ANACS report encountering scrapes, spotting, streaking and other damage to coins of all denominations in the sets. The prevalence of damage is resulting in the grading services being less generous in awarding the lofty Proof 70 grade that collectors covet, and that grade has been even more elusive from one firm than from the others.

2. How quickly will the Proof American Eagle palladium coins sell?, August 24, 2018 by Coin World. Story Summary: Maximum authorization set at 15,000 coins, with household limit of one on Sept. 6. When the Proof 2018-W American Eagle 1-ounce palladium coin goes on sale by the U.S. Mint beginning at noon Eastern Time Sept. 6, the big question could be how quickly it sells out, if it sells out. The Proof version of last year's bullion coin — which was the first palladium coin ever issued by the United States — will be limited to an edition of 15,000 pieces. A household limit of one coin is being imposed.

the San Francisco mint (S), the Dahlonega mint (D), the Charlotte mint (C), and the New Orleans mint (O).
