Minutes, Notes, and Happenings of previous months' meeting

Our previous meeting was held via Zoom on Tuesday January 12th, 2021. We had up to 15 members and 2 guests participating at various times during the Zoom session. One guest decided to join NSCC after the meeting. Welcome to John F. We also had another addition to the club in late January. Welcome to Mark B. The meeting was called to order by President Bob C. around 7:04.

Bob discussed his President's News Items.

There were no Coin shows to discuss.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes that were in the Newsletter.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers reports. We currently have \$2879.72 in the club account. (Remember that any adult member may see the complete Treasurer's report by simply requesting to view it at the meeting.)

New Business

The club received a nomination request from Don Kagin to be nominated for ANA President in the upcoming election. The club discussed this and decided to send in the nomination request.

A Zoom Virtual Bull Session was held on January 26th. The Zoom session had 9 club members participating. It was announced that the Denver Coin club program this month will be the reshowing of an ANA presentation on how to detect counterfeit Slabs. Bob C. showed off some of his collection including a Lynchburg Commem in NGC MS66, a 1958 Canadian dollar in PCGS MS66, a 1962 "Bugs Bunny" Franklin half in ANACS MS64, a 1963 Washington Quarter DDO in PCGS MS64, and 2014-P Australia PCGS PR70 DCAM Wedge Tail Eagle in High Relief. This coin is also a 1 oz. silver, Domed Coin. Mark H. showed off two coins he acquired from "The Colorado Collection" Auction that was part of the Houston Money Show. The pieces included an 1836 Large Cent EAC graded at VF35 and an 1839 Large Cent, Head of 1838, EAC graded at EF45/net 40 in a PCGS AU55 slab.

Bob C. also talked about a collection of "coins" that Tebo Coin had purchased from a person whose house had burned during the fires this fall north of Boulder. Not pretty. He also indicated that this person also had lost cash that was in the safe, as it burned up also from the extended time it was in the fire and the extreme heat.

Last Months' Show and Tell Recap

Bob C. – 1885-O Morgan Dollar in an old Rattler holder graded PCGS MS64 with a CAC sticker, an 1887 Morgan, Alligator Eye VAM, in a PCGS MS66 slab, a Wisconsin Commem in a PCGS MS66 slab with a CAC sticker, a 1938-D/D Buffalo nickel in a PCGS MS66 slab with a CAC sticker, a 1946 Iowa Commem in a PCGS MS67 slab, a 1959 "Goiter" Franklin half in PCGS Old Blue Holder XF40 slab, and a Australian Triangle Coin, Shipwreck Series, made from shipwreck silver. It was 1 oz. of silver with and Antiqued finish. He also had a Mayflower Compact 1 oz silver medal, and finally a Note from Costa Rica that had a Turtles on it.

Dave F. – had 2 Roman coins, the first with Apollo on the Obverse and Minerva on the Reverse. The second had Sol on the Obverse and a crescent moon with stars on the Reverse.

Mike K – Had an 1893 Liberty Nickel. The date was the same as in the title Bob B's. program from last month.

News Items

1. Coin Week Coin Givaway. If you sign up for the Coin Week Giveaway, you have a chance to win a free coin worth up to \$150 every week. 2. **How Morgan Dollars Became Indian Rupees,** Coin Week, February 5, 2021. The Pittman Act of 1918 called for not more than 350,000,000 silver dollars to be converted into bullion and sold to Great Britain at the rate of \$1 (plus Mint charges) per ounce. Ultimately, 270,232,722 silver dollars in Treasury Department vaults at the San Francisco and Philadelphia Mints were melted, with their silver being shipped to Calcutta (modern-day Kolkata) to be re-coined into India Rupee coins featuring the effigy of King George V.

3. **Brasher doubloon sets record at auction: \$9.36 million,** Coin World, January 22, 2020. A 1787 Brasher doubloon set a record for any U.S. gold coin when it realized \$9.36 million in Heritage Auctions' Jan. 21 auction. The sale makes it the second most expensive U.S. coin to sell at auction. The 1794 Flowing Hair Dollar is the most expensive coin ever sold at auction, selling for more than \$10 million in 2013. The Flowing Hair Dollar was the first dollar coin created by the U.S. government. The Brasher doubloon is the first issue of a private gold coinage in the United States.

4. **NGC certifies new mule die pairing from two \$1 coin series,** Coin World, January 15, 2021. A new, previously unreported mule coin, sporting a Sacagawea dollar obverse and Presidential dollar reverse was recently graded NGC Mint Error AU 58 with a notation of Discovery Coin. The person who submitted this Sacagawea-Presidential dollar mule to NGC reported making the discovery in a mixed bag of dollar coins obtained from a bank in 2019. It was eventually submitted to NGC for certification.

Interesting Coin Facts

From 1971 thru 1974 the US Mint packaged Proof Eisenhower Dollars in a separate plastic holder that was then placed in a cardboard sleave. These sleaves were Brown in color, so these proofs became known as "Brown Box" Ikes. These proofs were made from 40% silver planchets.
