ANA NEWS – The ANA election is official. Dr. Ralph W. Ross is to become the ANA’s 62nd President at the Chicago World’s Fair of Money in August. The new Vice-President is Joseph E. Boling. Governors were Mary Lynn Garret, Clifford Mishler, Shanna Schmidt, Michael Ellis, Rob Oberth, Charles Morgan, and Mark Lighterman. After 10 years of service, Greg Lyon will be leaving the Board due to term limits.

Our previous meeting was held via Zoom on Tuesday June 8th, 2021. We had up to 10 members participating at various times during the Zoom session.

The meeting was called to order by President Bob C. around 7:05.

Bob talked about having a combo in-person meeting and Zoom meeting at the same time when we can meet again at the Church.

Bob reviewed the Albuquerque show. Dave F. indicated he had a great show. Michael S. was also there.

Dave F. said there was a display of Turtle Coins (10 cases) at the show, and it was not Bob C’s!!!!

Bob discussed his President’s News Items and there was discussion on many items.

Noted that the 1933 Double Eagle sold at auction for over \$18 million.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes that were in the Newsletter.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurers reports. We currently have \$2728.72 in the club account. (Remember that any adult member may see the complete Treasurer’s report by simply requesting to view it at the meeting.)

A Zoom Virtual Bull Session was held on June 29th. There were 6 members in attendance at various times during the meeting.

There was some interesting discussion on auctions. Also talked about counterfeits and what the government is doing about them.

Bob C. - showed off some recent purchases. A 1909 VDB DDO, a 1913 Buffalo Nickel Type I DDR, a 1884-O Morgan dollar in a PCGS slab graded MS64 CAC, a 1885 Morgan dollar in a PCGS OGH slab

graded MS64, a 1898-O Morgan dollar in a PCGS slab graded MS65 CAC, and a Pilgrim 1920 Commemorative in a PCGS OGH slab graded MS65 CAC.

Dave F. - showed some Dan Carr products.

Last Months' Show and Tell Recap

Dave F. – Had a Japanese Medal from the EXPO'75 Okinawa International Ocean Exposition that had a fish on it, possibly a Trigger fish. A Roman coin with Julius Caesar that was struck in Spain by the Roman traveling Mint. The Reverse had a Gaelic trophy on it. Dave also related a news item that a 2000-year-old skeleton had been found on the beach near Pompeii with two gold coins. It is assumed that this was a Senior Praetorian Guard trying to rescue people during the eruption of Vesuvius. Dave also said he is handling the collection of late NSCC member Tim Ziebarth. It is now believed that Tim died from a heart attack while getting away from the Granby fire. Tim had collected many foreign coins minted by the US Mint.

John D'A – Had acquired some tokens (Bus Stop Bux) used at the old Bus Stop strip club in Boulder.

Bob C. – Had a 2021 Christa McAuliffe Silver Dollar Commemorative Proof. A book titled "Mint Errors To Die For" by Joseph P. Cronin. A 2021 Blanding's Turtle Canadian \$1 coin in a Specimen strike graded SP69 by NGC, and a 1885 Morgan Dollar in PCGS slab graded MS64PL CAC.

President's Notes

Northside Coin Club Meeting July 13th, 2020

News Items

1. **New American Eagle bullion coins entering market**, Coin World, July 2, 2021. The U.S. Mint's authorized purchasers were able to place orders beginning June 28 for the 2021 American Eagle, Reverse of 2021 gold and silver bullion coins. At least one authorized purchaser, APMEX, was accepting orders at the end of June for the new American Eagle gold and silver bullion coins with a delivery date to customers of July 7. They were priced \$11 to \$13 over spot on July 8 depending on the quantity purchased. The coins have new reverse designs, anti-counterfeiting devices and obverse designs that are updated from their original 1986 versions.

2. **Wrong date on Perth Mint mutant mule**, Coin World, July 2, 2021. The Perth Mint issued fewer than 400 examples of a 1-ounce silver dollar for Tuvalu struck by a die bearing the date 2018 rather than the intended 2021 dated dies, as the other approximately 49,600 examples are correctly dated. This error is classified as a mule, which results from pairing dies not originally intended to be used together. A spokesperson for the Perth Mint confirmed for Coin World that "less than 400 2018 Wolverine silver 1oz coins were produced. These are approved by the Government of Tuvalu." The mule discovery was first publicized by a YouTube content creator.

3. **Mint video addresses current coin 'shortages'**, Coin World, July 2, 2021. The United States Mint released an online video July 1 featuring Mint Director David J. Ryder addressing ongoing coin shortages throughout the country and ways to get sufficient coinage into general circulation where needed. The public service announcement video can be viewed in its entirety on the Mint's YouTube channel. "This is not a coinage supply problem. It's a circulation problem," Ryder says on the video. "We can't manufacture our way out of this problem. It's a problem of availability." Ryder said while it has been customary for 20% of coins in circulation to be new output from the U.S. Mint, the Mint is currently supplying circulation with 30% of the coins out there.

4. **Western bank gets 2021-D half dollars in non-Mint rolls**, Coin World, June 27, 2021. Washington State collector Daryl Anderson was pleasantly surprised in mid-June when he stopped at his local bank to acquire any rolls of U.S. half dollars he could search and was offered a \$500 face value box of circulation-quality 2021-D Kennedy half dollars. Beginning in 2002, collectors seeking circulation quality Kennedy half dollars from production at the Philadelphia and Denver Mints have had to purchase 20-coin paper-wrapped rolls directly from the U.S. Mint, as numismatic products at premiums above face value.

5. Dr. Ralph Ross Elected ANA President, Numismatic News, July 7, 2021. Incoming President Dr. Ralph W. Ross and Vice President-elect Joseph E. Boling will be joined by new board members Charles Morgan and Mark Lighterman, along with returning members Mary Lynn Garrett, Clifford Mishler, Shanna Schmidt, Michael Ellis and Rob Oberth. Mary Lynn Garrett was the top vote-receiver. Vice President-elect Joseph E. Boling ran unopposed. In accordance with ANA bylaws, ballots for uncontested offices are not tabulated. Ralph Ross beat Don Kagin for president by 17 votes.

6. 1933 double eagle tops \$18.8 million for new record, Coin World, June 8, 2021. The three lots sold at the auction (1 coin and 2 stamps) all together realized \$32,039,250, below the high estimate of \$37 million. While the double eagle exceeded the pre-sale estimate of \$10 million to \$15 million, the Inverted Jenny four-stamp plate block sold for \$4,860,000 and the British Guiana 1-cent black on magenta stamp realized \$8,307,000, falling below the low estimates.

We welcome people back to our building. The following is our covid protocols that we ask that you follow and respect. Each group will need to contact the office administrator who will assign the room that will fulfill the needs of your group to the best of our ability. Thank you for being a part of our community.

Please adhere to the following Covid guidelines:

1. Each group will need a point person for their group. Their responsibilities include:
 - a. Making a list and contact information for each group member in attendance (Optional)
 - b. Making sure the group adheres to the covid protocols below.
 - c. Making sure the room is left in the same condition as found.
2. Masks are optional for vaccinated people.
However, it is still best practice to wear masks all the time.
3. Open windows when weather permits and turn on furnace fans to help circulate air. When leaving the room, please close windows and turn off fans. If using Fellowship Hall - Please close doors when you leave.
4. Cleaning Protocols: Each group is responsible for cleaning your space after use. This helps with our janitorial services.
 - a. You will find a cleaning bucket and spray bottle in each room.
 - b. Cleaning Instructions are on the bucket
 - c. Return the bucket and spray bottle to the original space.
 - d. Please leave the room in the way that you found it.
