**PROGRAM** – The program will be “Columbian Exposition Collectibles” by club member John B.

**COIN of the MONTH** – National Park Washington Quarter. Bring a nice, no problems coin, which you, as a collector, would like to have.

[The “Coin of the Month” works as follows. Bring one coin of the type described as the featured coin of the month, preferably in a 2x2 or flip. If you bring a coin, you will get a ticket in the drawing and your coin goes into the pot. We then draw one ticket, and the winner gets the entire pot of coins that were featured.

### Last Months' Show and Tell Recap

Dave F. – A one Peso 2006 Philippines coin with reeded edge. A Philippines Coin Collector commissioned the piece to be made and it was produced by the Golden State Mint. Only about 50 exist and one sold at the 2006 World' Fair of Money in Denver.

John D'A – Had acquired some tokens (Bus Stop Bux) used at the old Bus Stop strip club in Boulder.

Bob C. – Had a 2005 Kansas State Quarter, in an old ANACS white holder, graded MS65. This is called a Humpback bison variety due to a die chip on the Bison's back. Also had a 2000 Saci dollar coin in a ANACS holder graded MS 62. This coin is known as the Wounded Eagle or Speared Eagle due to a die break through the Eagle.

Bear S – indicated that during COVID he began collecting coins containing nude figures. On such coin would be the 1916 or 1917 Variety 1 Standing Liberty Quarter.

### Prize Winners

Coin of the Month: 20<sup>th</sup> Century Coin (dated 1900-1999). Jim F. won the pot of 5 coins.

Door Prize: 2003-S Jefferson Nickel graded PR69 Ultra Cameo by NGC was won by Terry K.

### Program

The program in July was "The Evolution of the Peace Dollar Design" by Dan Carr. Dan gave a wonderfully informative program on how the Peace Dollar Design evolved from the initial high relief design of 1921 as a coin to Commemorate the ending of WWI. Through the high and low relief designs in 1922, that can be detected by a 4<sup>th</sup> Ray or lack of the 4<sup>th</sup> Ray by the ONE on the reverse. The 1926 die revision that strengthened the word GOD on the Obverse. The infamous 1964 Peace dollar and the 1970 used to test the use of Clad planchets that would be used for the IKE dollars.

# President's Notes

## Northside Coin Club Meeting August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020

### News Items

1. NSCC member David Grosek passed away from cancer on Friday, August 6. I found out about this a few days before going to Chicago. I will pass along any additional information I find out at our meeting.

2. **Morgan dollars sell quickly on first day**, Coin World, August 6, 2021. The 2021-D Morgan dollar (shown) and the companion 2021-S dollar reached the "unavailable" status in 20 to 25 minutes during the first day of sales, though not all of the coins were sold. Ordering for each of the two numismatic product offerings was restricted to three coins each per household.

3. **U.S. Mint plans public auction of Ryder-struck coins**, Coin World, August 2, 2021. The United States Mint is moving into uncharted territory with its announcement that it will sell 500 four-coin sets of American Eagle gold and silver bullion coins marking this year's design changes, with all of the coins personally struck by Mint Director David Ryder. The coins will be auctioned to the public later in 2021. The sets will contain common coins indistinguishable from other coins of the same types. Bidders will be bidding on the accompanying COA with the Ryder's autograph, essentially.

4. **AAFES Phases Out Pogs**, Numismatic News, July 26, 2021. In November 2001 the military exchange store retailer Army and Air Force Exchange Service or AAFES announced the exchange would begin using cardboard pogs as a substitute for coins at U.S. facilities in Afghanistan. Pogs are lighter than metal composition coins and for that reason are less expensive to ship overseas. The first AAFES pog issue simply carries information identifying the pog's face value. Since 2001 pogs evolved into a collectible, some depicting images of troops, aircraft, comic book characters, and even NASCAR drivers. On May 19 the military newspaper Stars and Stripes announced this temporary metal coin replacement will finally be phased out as the U.S. military leaves Afghanistan. The target date for troop and pog withdrawal is September 11.

5. **Fred Weinberg's Personal Error Coin Rarities on Display at Heritage Auctions' ANA Booth**, Coin Week, Longtime collector and error dealer Fred Weinberg has decided to retire after 50 years of being perhaps the most famous face in Mint errors and earning his own pedigree for his error coins certified by PCGS. His retirement means fellow error coin enthusiasts have a chance to acquire many hundreds of coveted error coins during the next year. Two special coins that will be on display during ANA: one of the finest 1880-S Off Center Morgan dollars and a Sacagawea Quarter/Quarter Mule featuring a coveted state series quarter obverse – one of the roughly 20 known to exist. Following the display at ANA, the coins will head to Heritage's Florida United Numismatic (FUN) auctions next year while hundreds of additional coins from his collection are set for auctions throughout 2022.

**Building Usage Agreement  
COVID Addendum**

We welcome people back to our building. The following is our covid protocols that we ask that you follow and respect. Each group will need to contact the office administrator who will assign the room that will fulfill the needs of your group to the best of our ability. Thank you for being a part of our community.

**Please adhere to the following Covid guidelines:**

1. Each group will need a point person for their group. Their responsibilities include:
  - a. Making a list and contact information for each group member in attendance (Optional)
  - b. Making sure the group adheres to the covid protocols below.
  - c. Making sure the room is left in the same condition as found.
  
2. Masks are optional for vaccinated people.  
However, it is still best practice to wear masks all the time.
  
3. Open windows when weather permits and turn on furnace fans to help circulate air. When leaving the room, please close windows and turn off fans. If using Fellowship Hall - Please close doors when you leave.
  
4. Cleaning Protocols: Each group is responsible for cleaning your space after use. This helps with our janitorial services.
  - a. You will find a cleaning bucket and spray bottle in each room.
  - b. Cleaning Instructions are on the bucket
  - c. Return the bucket and spray bottle to the original space.
  - d. Please leave the room in the way that you found it.
