COIN of the MONTH – No Coin of the Month this month.

ANA NEWS – More than 850 gold, silver and bronze medals related to President George Washington that were deaccessioned by the Historical Society of Pennsylvania have been donated intact to the American Numismatic Association's (money.org) Edward C. Rochette Money Museum by prominent California rare coin dealer and real estate developer Dwight Manley. Manley's generous donation also includes other important Washington-related medals he separately acquired over the years that were not part of the historical society's collection originally assembled by 19th century numismatist and researcher William Spohn Baker (1824-1897). In all, more than 1,000 medals and coins are in the donation.

UPCOMING PROGRAMS – Classic Commemorative Coins – Stopping the Runaway Train in 1939. Seeing hidden images on banknotes under UV light. Cherry Pickers Guide, old TV episodes with “Coin” themes.

Dave Wi. – had some tokens including a Good For \$.25 in Goods & Trade at C.H. Patterson in Grand Junction, tokens for Colorado Correctional Institution inmates to buy Coke for the soda machine, and some Colorado Tax tokens.

Bob C. – Had an 1878 VAM 9 Morgan Dollar with a VSS (Variety Slabbing Service) sticker indicating that it was a VAM 9. It had probably been cleaned and J.P. Martin of ANACS confirmed it had been cleaned and had nice AU details. Bob picked it up for XF money. He also had a 1888-O Morgan in a PCGS MS64 slab that had a clash E on the reverse, this is a VAM 183, a 1944 Walking Liberty Half that was an FS 502 RPM2, a 1922-D Peace Dollar in an ANACS MS 63 slab with a 35 degree die rotation, and finally the turtle coin you have been waiting for, a Aegean Turtle Coin from 480-457 BC.
