PROGRAM – The program will be “Hands on Grading Exercise” by club member Michael S.

COIN of the MONTH – 19th Century Coin (dated 1800-1899). Bring a nice, no problems coin, which you, as a collector, would like to have.

[The “Coin of the Month” works as follows. Bring one coin, of the type described as the featured coin of the month, preferably in a 2x2 or flip. If you bring a coin, you will get a ticket in the drawing and your coin goes into the pot. We then draw one ticket and the winner gets the entire pot of coins that were featured.

SHOW and TELL – Have some interesting item from your collection that you would like to show/talk about with the members. Have it ready (take some pictures ahead of time and have them ready to share) for the Zoom meeting and give a quick (1 minute) talk on.

ANA NEWS – The ANA announced on September 21st that during an open session meeting on January 19, 2021, the ANA Board of Governors honored the wishes of nearly 20 past Farran Zerbe Memorial Award winners by voting to remove Zerbe's name from the ANA's highest honor after the 2021 presentation (its 70th year). According to the motion, the accolade will be called the Distinguished Service Award "until such time as the name of an exemplary, deceased ANA member be brought forward to the Board, after vetting by the Awards Committee, for consideration of formal approval with proper funding arrangements for such naming rights."

The program in September was “Una and the Lion” by club member Bob B.

Bob stated that William Wyon did the “Unimprovable Design” in 1839 to commemorate the beginning of Queen Victoria’s reign. The Reverse was based on Edmund Spenser’s poem “The Faerie Queene”. Una was a symbolic personification of Queen Victoria and the Lion symbolized England. The coin was issued from 1839 until 1886. There are about 100 certified by PCGS and NGC of the 400 minted.

News Items

1. **Pobjoy Mint releases 5-ounce 'Morgan dollar'**, Coin World, October 3, 2021. The Pobjoy Mint, following the immediate sellout of its 1-ounce silver coin honoring the Morgan dollar, has created a 5-ounce version honoring the Morgan and Peace dollars.

2. **David J. Ryder leaves Mint position on Oct. 1**, Coin World, October 1, 2021. It is accurate to say that collectors, in general, welcomed the news that he was stepping down as Mint director. Ryder served 14 months as mint director under President George H.W. Bush. During his second term as Mint director the Mint finally acknowledged that the counterfeiting of U.S. coins was a significant problem and took the first small steps toward fighting the counterfeiting of American Eagle bullion coins.

3. **Top 1893-S dollar brings series record \$2,086,875**, Coin World, September 3, 2021. The finest-known 1893-S Morgan dollar sold for \$2,086,875 at an August 29 GreatCollections sale, setting a record for the online auctioneer and for any Morgan silver dollar at auction. The Morgan dollar was graded Mint State 67 by Professional Coin Grading Service and had a green CAC sticker.

4. **Homage to the world's major bullion coin icons, all merged into a kilo silver cube**, AG/AU News, October 8, 2021. One of the six faces of this coin are set aside for an obverse, in this case the coat of arms of Gibraltar, a beautiful piece of national symbolism, but the other five depict scenes clearly inspired by ten major bullion coins (well, nine and the Kiwi...), two per face. The American Eagle and South African Springbok share a face, as do the instruments from the Austrian Philharmonic and the Mexican Libertad. The Kiwi and Kangaroo co-exist on one face, and the Chinese Panda and Russian St George on another. On the fifth face sits the British Britannia and the Canadian Maple Leaf. It's a kilo of 0.999 silver, so not a bargain basement piece. It has a mintage of just 199 pieces. One vendor had it on presale at 2,200 Euros.

The following is a list of requirements from the Church that we will need to follow to begin using the Fellowship Hall again for in person club meetings.

Building Usage Agreement COVID Addendum

We welcome people back to our building. The following is our covid protocols that we ask that you follow and respect. Each group will need to contact the office administrator who will assign the room that will fulfill the needs of your group to the best of our ability. Thank you for being a part of our community.

Please adhere to the following Covid guidelines:

1. Each group will need a point person for their group. Their responsibilities include:
 - a. Making a list and contact information for each group member in attendance (Optional)
 - b. Making sure the group adheres to the covid protocols below.
 - c. Making sure the room is left in the same condition as found.

2. Masks are optional for vaccinated people.
However, it is still best practice to wear masks all the time.

3. Open windows when weather permits and turn on furnace fans to help circulate air. When leaving the room, please close windows and turn off fans. If using Fellowship Hall - Please close doors when you leave.

4. Cleaning Protocols: Each group is responsible for cleaning your space after use. This helps with our janitorial services.
 - a. You will find a cleaning bucket and spray bottle in each room.
 - b. Cleaning Instructions are on the bucket
 - c. Return the bucket and spray bottle to the original space.
 - d. Please leave the room in the way that you found it.

5. Bathrooms in the main area are limited to one person at a time. Please take note of the vacancy / occupied sign outside each bathroom.

The preschool hallway and area are off limits Monday - Thursday 8:00 a.m. - 2 p.m. People are not allowed in these areas. If a group member needs to visit the office during this time, they need to exit the building and walk around on the outside and go to the office door.
