News Items

1. **A baseball star's 1863 Seated Liberty dollar**, Coin World, January 4, 2022. Baseball star Andre Dawson's 1863 Seated Liberty dollar, graded MS-67, sold in December for \$114,000, more than double what it realized in 1998. In 1998 Andre Dawson consigned dozens of coins with his name listed on the pedigree line of the encasement. However, it has been years since we have seen another coin with his name in the pedigree, leading us to believe most have been upgraded or crossed over, leaving very few coins directly attributable to his collection.

2. **The Bradford Exchange Silver Dollar Express Illuminated Electric Train Collection**. Train comes in 3 issues: Morgan Silver Dollar Steam Locomotive, Peace Silver Dollar Tender with FREE train operating system and removable replica sculpture of Silver Dollar era coins, and American Eagle Silver Dollar Box car. Each issue is \$89.99. If you want to actually run your silver dollar train around on a track, for \$49.99 you can get 10 9-1/2 inch tracks. Total cost would be \$320.

3. **Monday Morning Brief for Dec. 20, 2021: A year of changes**, Coin World, December 20, 2021. Some of the top stories of 2021:

- a. Q. David Bowers has retired as a regular columnist. He not only ended his "The Joys of Collecting" column for Coin World but also stepped down from his monthly "Coins & Collectors" column in The Numismatist, the journal of the American Numismatic Association.
- b. The sale of the only 1933 Saint-Gaudens gold \$20 double eagle authorized for private ownership established a new price record for any coin. That famed 1933 double eagle was offered again this summer, now graded Mint State 65 by PCGS and bearing a green CAC sticker, selling for a final price of \$18,872,250. The result more than doubled what the coin realized in its first appearance at auction, in 2002, when the double eagle brought \$7,590,020.
- c. The United States Mint made design changes to the gold and silver American Eagle coins which resulted in two distinct design types for the year.
- d. The Mint offered five 2021 Morgan dollars and a single 2021 Peace dollar to mark the centennial of the transition from the Morgan design to the Peace design in 1921.

4. **Collectors discover 1977-D half dollar on silver planchet**, Coin World, November 19, 2021. The 1977 Kennedy half dollar mintage of 31.4 million coins was all to have been struck on copper-nickel clad composition blanks. Error coin experts believe an unknown number of the silver-copper clad planchets from the San Francisco Mint were transferred to the Denver Mint mixed with copper-nickel clad planchets. Maine

collector Craig Wildes found the error coin in a 20-coin roll of half dollars in September from a central Texas bank. Wildes said he and his collector friend — who wishes to remain anonymous — search through thousands of half dollars weekly. Four times a year, Wildes said, he and his collector friend take week-long “prospecting” excursions around the United States, preferably to out-of-the-way locations, visiting banks in search of half dollar rolls.

5. Dinosaurs Down Under First Coin of 2022 Struck by Royal Australian Mint, Coin Week, January 3, 2022. In previous years, the Australian Mint’s First Coin of the Year Event attracted hundreds of coin collectors to the Mint in the hope that they will get to press the first coin. Due to COVID-19 concerns, the event was made digital for 2021 and 2022. Centenary of the Royal Australian Air Force celebrated on first coin of 2021. Dorothy the Dinosaur, Australia’s most famous dinosaur and much-loved friend of The Wiggles, was on hand at the Royal Australian Mint to mint the first coin in the world for 2022.

Building Usage Agreement COVID Addendum

The following is our covid protocols that we ask that you follow and respect. Each group will need to contact the office administrator who will assign the room that will fulfill the needs of your group to the best of our ability. Thank you for being a part of our community.

Please adhere to the following Covid guidelines:

1. Each group will need a point person for their group. Their responsibilities include:
 - a. Making a list and contact information for each group member in attendance (Optional)
 - b. Making sure the group adheres to the covid protocols below.
 - c. Making sure the room is left in the same condition as found.

2. Masks are optional for vaccinated people.
However, it is still best practice to wear masks all the time.

3. Open windows when weather permits and turn on furnace fans to help circulate air. When leaving the room, please close windows and turn off fans. If using Fellowship Hall - Please close doors when you leave.

4. Cleaning Protocols: Each group is responsible for cleaning your space after use. This helps with our janitorial services.
 - a. You will find a cleaning bucket and spray bottle in each room.
 - b. Cleaning Instructions are on the bucket
 - c. Return the bucket and spray bottle to the original space.
 - d. Please leave the room in the way that you found it.

5. Bathrooms in the main area are limited to one person at a time. Please take note of the vacancy / occupied sign outside each bathroom.

The preschool hallway and area are off limits Monday - Thursday 8:00 a.m. - 2 p.m. People are not allowed in these areas. If a group member needs to visit the office during this time, they need to exit the building and walk around on the outside and go to the office door.
