News Items

1. **Pobjoy Mint honors Morgan dollar, again**, Coin World, January 15, 2022. The Pobjoy Mint continues honoring the Peace and Morgan dollar coins with modern commemoratives, now with a 2-ounce silver \$20 coin with a Pearl Black finish. It has a mintage limit of 250 pieces and retails for \$199.

2. **\$12 Million for America's First Silver Dollar**, Numismatic News, February 4, 2022. An exceedingly rare coin minted in 1794, a Flowing Hair dollar that is widely believed to be the very first silver dollar struck by the United States, has sold for a world record \$12 million. The coin was acquired by GreatCollections for a client. Only about 140 silver dollars exist today out of the original mintage of 1,758, and this is the only example designated "Specimen" by Professional Coin Grading Service (PCGS), who assigned a grade of SP-66. It is also approved by Certified Acceptance Corporation (CAC).

3. **GSA Hoard Morgan Dollar Carson City Sets**, PCGS.com, August 26, 2013. This year PCGS announced that a new, large-sized holder had been created for the GSA Morgan dollars. Up until this time, PCGS would break out the coin from the GSA holder and place it in the standard PCGS holder. Collectors were asking for an improved way to handle these coins and PCGS listened. These special holdered coins receive new coin numbers to separate them from the generic coin number assigned to the date.

4. **A Glowing Recommendation for Notes, Collecting Paper Column by Wendell Wolka**, Coin World, November 27, 2017. While recently working on some world notes, I rediscovered a different way to collect paper money. One of the more recent innovations of legitimate bank note printers is the use of fluorescent or ultraviolet inks to print "secret" and, to the naked eye, invisible design features, as well as design elements that either "glow" or change color when exposed to ultraviolet light. A wide array of world notes make use of fluorescent inks and just browsing through your more recent notes (those issued since roughly the 1980s) can make for an entertaining and eye opening experience. One of my favorite bank notes that carries a "secret" design element is from Columbia. This 1,000-peso note is neither rare nor expensive. It depicts an early Columbian politician, Jorge Eliecer Gaitan. Under UV light, an image of his favorite car appears in the crowd scene! So you never know what you might find on even the more "common" modern notes.

The following is our covid protocols that we ask that you follow and respect. Each group will need to contact the office administrator who will assign the room that will fulfill the needs of your group to the best of our ability. Thank you for being a part of our community.

Please adhere to the following Covid guidelines:

1. Each group will need a point person for their group. Their responsibilities include:
 - a. Making a list and contact information for each group member in attendance (Optional)
 - b. Making sure the group adheres to the covid protocols below.
 - c. Making sure the room is left in the same condition as found.

2. Masks are optional for vaccinated people.
However, it is still best practice to wear masks all the time.

3. Open windows when weather permits and turn on furnace fans to help circulate air. When leaving the room, please close windows and turn off fans. If using Fellowship Hall - Please close doors when you leave.

4. Cleaning Protocols: Each group is responsible for cleaning your space after use. This helps with our janitorial services.
 - a. You will find a cleaning bucket and spray bottle in each room.
 - b. Cleaning Instructions are on the bucket
 - c. Return the bucket and spray bottle to the original space.
 - d. Please leave the room in the way that you found it.

5. Bathrooms in the main area are limited to one person at a time. Please take note of the vacancy / occupied sign outside each bathroom.

The preschool hallway and area are off limits Monday - Thursday 8:00 a.m. - 2 p.m. People are not allowed in these areas. If a group member needs to visit the office during this time, they need to exit the building and walk around on the outside and go to the office door.
