Last Months' Show and Tell Recap

Terry K. – Had a Civil War Token in an old blue ANACS holder graded AU58. The token stated “Fine Ale drawn from wood” and had an address of 95 Bowery NY city. He also had an older type holder that displayed a picture of the New Orleans Mint and also contained an Morgan dollar with an “O” mintmark. The coin exhibited some crescent toning.

Bob C. – Had a turtle coin graded PR68 DeepCam. He also had an 1878 7TF Rev of 78 Morgan dollar in a PCGS MS63 slab. The coin was mis-attributed and should have said 7over8 weak TF. He had a 1925 Norse Thick American Centennial Medal in an NGC MS64 slab. Bob also indicated that Dan Carr is now making a 1925-D version which are struck over used Walker halves.

John F. – had a recently acquired 1825 Bust Half in PCGS AU58, and a 1809 in NGC XF45. The Reverse looks better than 45 and there is a die crack through AMERICA on the reverse.

Dave F. – Had a Dan Carr piece called the Puppet Master. It was 2 oz. of silver and there were only 25 made.

News Items

1. **Proof American Women Quarters set is nearly sold out**, *Coin World*, March 11, 2022. Enrollments by U.S. Mint customers through March 7 for the five-coin copper-nickel clad Proof American Women quarter dollars set were nearly sufficient to deplete the Mint's total inventory planned for the numismatic product. Enrollment demand is also strong for the five-coin silver Proof America Women Quarters set.

2. **'Big 4' U.S. rarities in GreatCollections exhibit at CSNS convention**, *Coin World*, March 11, 2022. Four extraordinary U.S. coins will be exhibited by GreatCollections at the Central States Numismatic Society's convention from April 28 to 30. The GreatCollections exhibit will feature four coins that the firm says are among the most significant U.S. rarities of the 19th and 20th centuries. The exhibit will feature the Class I ("Original") 1804 Draped Bust dollar presented as a diplomatic gift to the Sultan of Muscat in 1835 by the U.S. State Department on behalf of President Andrew Jackson. The dollar, certified Proof 68 by Professional Coin Grading Service, was once owned by D. Brent Pogue. Also exhibited will be an 1894-S Barber dime, one of nine known today of the 24 Barber dimes recorded as struck at the San Francisco Mint in 1894. The example in the GreatCollections exhibit is the finest known, certified Proof 65+ by PCGS. The coin was once in the collection of 20th century Baltimore numismatist Louis B. Eliasberg Sr. Eliasberg's 1913 Liberty Head 5-cent coin is also in the GreatCollections exhibit. Of the five legendary 1913 Liberty Head 5-cent coins known, three are in private hands. The example in the upcoming exhibit is graded Proof 66 by PCGS, with a Certified Acceptance Corp. green sticker. The fourth coin included in the GreatCollections exhibit is a 1943 Lincoln bronze cent. From the Bob R. Simpson Collection, the error coin is graded About Uncirculated 58 by PCGS, with a CAC sticker. The remarkable wrong planchet errors were once described by David Lange as "error coin royalty" in his book *Complete Guide to Lincoln Cents*. The April 27 through 30 show will be held, as it has been for several years, at the Renaissance Hotel and Convention Center, in Schaumburg, Illinois.
