Last Months' Show and Tell Recap

Terry K. – Had a 1916 Standing Liberty Quarter that was graded G4 by ANACS. He acquired it in an auction and was needed for his First Year of issue Type Set he is working on.

Bob C. – Talked about a 1911-D Gold coin that came into Tebo, where he works, as part of a group of otherwise rather ordinary coins. The only coin of any significance was the 1911-D. He also showed his 2021 Morgan and Peace dollars. He showed an 1886-S Morgan dollar in an PCGS OGH grading MS62 that was an upgrade for his collection. Finally, he had a 2000-P wounded eagle SAC dollar.

Dave Wi. – Acquired a 1927 2½ Gold coin from a Jewelry store where he works part time at their cost. He also found a 1913, Type 1, Buffalo nickel in change that probably graded high XF to AU.

Dave F. – Had a gold medal from the Tim Ziebarth collection that was about 1 2/3 inches in diameter and was 2¼ oz of gold. It was minted in 1842. In doing research on it, he believes it will bring between 10-20K at auction. The medal is in extreme high relief.

Prize Winners

Coin of the Month: A Winged Liberty “Mercury” Dime. A pot of 4 coins was won by Dave Wi .

Door Prize: A Raw 1960-D Franklin Half was won by Gary B.

Raffle Prize: A 2020-D Jefferson Nickel graded MS67 6FS by NGC and marked as “Early Release” on the slab, was won by new member Dalton J.

Youth Door Prize: No prize was given out this month.

Program

The program in March was “2022 Coin of the Year” by NSCC Board Member, Bob C. Bob reviewed the 10 categories and talked about the winner in each category. The US entry in the Most Significant Historical coin won with its’ Women’s Suffrage Silver Dollar. The Austrian mint had 3 winners. The Bank of Latvia had 2 winners. The Austrian mint won the Coin of the Year with their entry in the Best Gold Coin category. Their entry was a 100 Euro “The Gold of the Pharaohs” coin. Austria has won in the last 7 out of 12 years

News Items

1. A Roman Coin Minted as a Salute to Julius Caesar's Assassination Is Up for Auction
The 2,000-year-old gold piece, perhaps worn by one of the murderers, could sell for \$2 million, *Smithsonian*, March 23, 2022. A rare golden coin, one of just three known specimens in the world, is likely to tempt buyers with deep pockets at auction later this spring. Experts estimate that the historical coin could sell for as much as \$2 million when it goes on the chopping block in Zurich, reports Marina Stanley for Bloomberg. The auction is May 30.

2. From the Dark Corner: An "Authenticated" Counterfeit 1854 Huge O Liberty Seated Quarter, *Coin World*, February 25, 2022. The cap, Liberty's hand, the eagle's left talons, and the "OL" of DOLLAR all had to be "tooled"/re-engraved to complete the repairs and show exactly in the struck counterfeits, but NOT in the genuine example!

3. Pobjoy Mint Offers Mythical Creatures – Siren Coin With Iridescent Effect, *Coin World*, March 29, 2022. The first coin being issued features The Siren. A further four coins will be released to add to this series featuring The Hydra, The Minotaur, The Centaur, and Medusa.

4. Unusual Items: US Mint 'Gold Disks' Made for Oil Payments to Saudi Arabia, *Coin World*, April 3, 2022. One of the things we find most exciting about reporting on the numismatic marketplace is coming across those things we either didn't know beforehand or finding obscure and unusual numismatic items. Just recently we came across one such item, gold disks produced by the United States Mint for ARAMCO oil payments to Saudi Arabia after World War II.

5. Ancient Roman Coins – Vespasian Aureus Buried at Pompeii, *Coin World*, April 3, 2022. Among those who escaped was the owner of Villa Pisanella, a popular wine producing villa rustica on the south eastern slopes of Vesuvius near the modern-day village of Boscoreale. It is believed that the owner was Lucius Caecilius Iucundus, a wealthy merchant who was the highly successful son of a freed slave. The soil around volcanoes is highly fertile and great for growing crops, allowing the owners to amass significant wealth. In 1895, excavators uncovered 109 gold and silver plates and hundreds of gold aurei. The coins were stored in an empty cistern in the wine cellar of the villa when the owner fled. With a general exchange rate of one aureus as pay for one month of work, this amount of gold would constitute a lifetime of profit.

7. French farmer finds rare coin featuring Charlemagne just before his death

The portrait confirms that Charlemagne had a short neck., *livescience.com*, April 1, 2022. A rare 1,200-year-old silver coin featuring Charlemagne — one of the only known portraits made of the emperor during his lifetime — was recently rediscovered and promptly taken on a wild journey from a farm in France, to the bidding grounds of eBay and, finally, to a museum in Germany.

8. **Very Rare NGC-certified Henry VII Sovereign Offered in Taisei Auction**, *ngccoin.com*, April 4, 2022. The earliest gold Sovereign that a collector can own will be offered in the April 2022 sale. An extremely rare Type 2 Henry VII Sovereign hand-struck in gold more than 500 years ago and now certified by Numismatic Guaranty Company™ (NGC®) is being offered in an auction presented by Taisei Coins and The Royal Mint. Bidding opens at ¥100,000,000 (about \$800,000 USD) for this historic coin in the auction being held in Tokyo on April 29, 2022.

10. **United States 1974-D Kennedy Half Dollar**, *Coin World*, April 6, 2022. 1974 was an interesting year at the Denver Mint. Not only was planning for the 1975/76 Bicentennial coinage well underway but the Denver facility was also preparing to move locations. In 1973, the Mint had announced that the new location would be near the South Platte River. However, as the Director of the Mint Mary T. Brooks stated in a press release, the railroad companies lobbied to stop this move since the new facility would interrupt their planned track extensions, and thus the Mint was forced to change plans.
