### Last Months' Show and Tell Recap

Bob C. – Sold an 1882-S Morgan dollar graded MS65 in a PCGS CAC OGH to Jerry Bobbe. Jerry is a former PCGS grader and Summer Seminar instructor. Had a 2021 coin from Republic of Chad that contained 2 oz. of silver and an 11½ oz. copper core, basically a paper weight. Oh, it also had a turtle on it! A 1948 PL Franklin Half from Dan Carr. Finally, an 1875-CC 20 cent piece graded G6 by PCGS in an Old Blue Holder with a CAC sticker.

Terry K. – A “Six Events in Flight” coin set. Each coin was 2/3 oz. of silver and they had great toning. A Chow-En-Lai 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Proof coin from China. A California fractional gold coin, and a 1908 St. Gaudens, No Motto, \$20 gold coin graded MS63 by PCGS in a rattler holder.

There were two primary gold coins, the 20 Franc and the 40 Franc. There were 7 different designs for these coins, and they were minted from 1802 through 1815. There were approximately 19 million 20 Franc coins minted and 3.5 million 40 Franc coins minted during the 14-year period.

# President's Notes

Northside Coin Club Meeting June 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022

## News Items

1. **Largest coin in The Royal Mint's history passes Trial of the Pyx**, *Canadian Coin News*, May 6, 2022. Today at Goldsmiths' Hall in London, the Queen's Remembrancer, Senior Master Barbara Fontaine, pronounced the verdict on the 7,968 coins submitted at the Trial of the Pyx in January, including the 10Kg "Queens' Beasts" gold proof – the largest coin ever created by the Royal Mint.

2. **Roman coins found in Pewsey sell for £81k at auction**, *BBC*, May 17, 2022. A collection of rare Roman coins discovered by three friends have sold at auction for £81,160. Three metal detectorists found the coins near Pewsey in September 2020. The hoard of 142 coins was expected to sell for between £30,000 and £40,000. Nigel Mills, from Noonans in London, where the coins were auctioned, said: "Virtually all of the coins are in mint condition and have not even needed to be cleaned since their discovery."

3. **Jeff Garrett: Weighing the Opportunities in Coin Collecting**, *Coin Week*, May 27, 2022. For example, let's say the seller is asking \$10,000 for a certain coin. I will check current price guides, population information, and recent auction records. Hopefully, I will also have handled an example of the issue at one time or another. After a close study, I might determine that in the worst case, the coin would bring \$9,500, and if things work out, the coin could sell for \$12,000. The potential \$2,000 profit outweighs the possible \$500 loss.

4. **NGC Certifies Unique Off-Center 'Grand Snake' 1882-CC Morgan Dollar in GSA Holder**, *NGC*, May 20, 2022. During the evaluation process, a handful of "oddities" (as mint errors were often called back then) were discovered. But one was "eye-catching" — an 1882-CC that was struck off-center! It was referred to as the "Grand Snake" by Mint technicians. The terminology used internally by the Mint does not always correspond directly to what is used in the numismatic/collecting community. Thus, a "snake" coin is referred to as an off-center by collectors.

5. **The shipwreck effect: How NGC grades coins recovered from the sea**, *Coin Update*, May 19, 2022. Look closely at a coin that has been recovered from the sea, and you might see damage caused by saltwater. Or you might not. The effect that saltwater has on a coin depends on a variety of factors. The most important is the type of metal from which the coin was minted. There are some metals that are remarkably resilient to the corrosive effects of saltwater. Gold is one of them. As a result, gold coins can be lost at sea for hundreds of years and be virtually unaffected.

6. **Breaking news: experts identify overdate 1943/1942-S cent**, *Coin World*, May 26, 2022. A new World War II overdate variety, a 1943/1942-S Lincoln cent, has been identified by variety experts, after being listed as a “regular” 1943 Lincoln, Doubled Die Obverse cent for years.

7. **The Coin Analyst: Extremely Rare Mexican Silver Pattern Coin Surfaces**, *Coin Week*, May 19, 2022. A coin collector and part-time dealer named Adrian Coro, who specializes in circulating Mexican coinage, recently made the find of a lifetime when he came across a Mexican 1947 silver 50 centavos coin that numismatists did not think even existed. The piece is so rare that officials from the Banco de Mexico, which oversees the mint, said they have never seen an example, and it is not part of their legendary collection of Mexican coins that rivals the Smithsonian’s collection of American coins in its completeness. The piece is believed to be what collectors like to call “one of one”, or unique.

8. **Couple Find 5 Rare 14th-Century Gold Coins in Field**, *Newsweek*, May 20, 2022. The coins from the reign of King Edward III are 1.3 inches in diameter and show the Plantagenet monarch in a ship holding a sword and shield on one side, and the royal cross on the other.

9. **Recovered bell from fabled “Ship of Gold,” the S.S. Central America, donated to U.S. Naval Academy**, *Coin Update*, May 23, 2022. The United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland, has received an important piece of American and naval history, the bell from the S.S. Central America, the legendary “Ship of Gold” that was led by Commander William Lewis Herndon (1813-1857). The famous ship sank in 1857 while carrying 578 passengers and crewmembers and a king’s ransom of California Gold Rush treasures.

10. **Queen's Platinum Jubilee: Royal Mint unveils largest coin**, *Coin Week*, May 25, 2022. A huge gold coin has been produced by the Royal Mint to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. The 15kg coin was commissioned by an anonymous private UK collector for an undisclosed sum, and its designs on both sides were approved by the Queen. With a diameter of 220mm (8.6in), it is the largest coin the mint, at Llantrisant in south Wales, has produced in its 1,100 years. The coin has a face value of £15,000, and it took nearly 400 hours to make. Designed by coinage artist John Bergdahl, the mint said it was "hand crafted to the highest standard".

11. **Certified Coin Marketplace – CAC-Approved Coins Bring Premiums in April 2022**, *Coin Week*, May 25, 2022. 1921 Peace Dollar in MS-66 On April 5, in consecutive lots, Stack's Bowers auctioned two PCGS-graded MS-66 1921 Peace dollars. The CAC-approved coin realized \$24,000 USD and the coin without a CAC sticker realized \$9,600.

12. **Helmets on Ancient Greek Coins**, *Coin Week*, May 26, 2022. One can readily see the need for a helmet in which battles were fought up close and personal – a single blow to an unprotected head usually ended the fight if it made contact with sufficient force. Pictures of Sumerian warriors from 4000 BCE are shown wearing a helmet (Figure 1), and it seems to be a simple head covering of bronze similar to some of the Greek helmets. Of course, all the militarist empires that followed, such as the Akkadians, the Assyrians, the Babylonians, the Egyptians, the Hittites, etc., used helmets, so there is a long history of helmet construction, modification, and use prior to the height of the Greek Bronze Age of the Iliad.

13. **Market Analysis: 'Perfect' 1962 quarter sells for \$7,800**, *Coin World*, May 28, 2022. The new American Women quarter dollars, introduced into circulation this year, have brought attention to the Washington quarter dollar series, which has long been a collector favorite. Heritage Auctions offered some nice examples featuring John Flanagan's original design at its recent early May sales held after the Central States Numismatic Society convention, including what Heritage billed as "the sole finest pre-1965 silver Proof" quarter. The 1962 Washington quarter dollar, graded Proof 70 Deep Cameo by Professional Coin Grading Service, is one of only 66 Proof 1950 to 1964 Washington quarter dollars graded a "perfect" Proof 70, and is the sole example designated Deep Cameo. Heritage wrote, "As flawless as it gets, this piece is brilliant and starkly contrasted, showing depth of mirroring and strike excellence that rivals that seen on most modern proofs."
