President's Notes

Northside Coin Club Meeting August 9th, 2022

News Items

1. **\$100 Million of Rare Coins and Gold Rush Sunken Treasure at Chicago World's Fair of Money**, *Money.org*, July 13, 2022. Visitors can also see museum-quality displays of documents signed by Presidents Washington, Jefferson, Lincoln and others; a \$3 million nickel; and a rare silver dollar insured for \$4 million. Another highlight of the show will be an extraordinary exhibit of historic California Gold Rush artifacts recovered from the 1857 sinking of the fabled "Ship of Gold," the S.S. Central America, including the remnants of a Wells Fargo treasure shipment box.

2. **Federal Reserve puts 2022 half dollars into circulation**, *Coin World*, July 8, 2022. There apparently is a need for Kennedy half dollars, as the Federal Reserve has placed orders for millions of circulation quality coins for release into commerce channels in 2022. U.S. Mint spokesman Michael White informed *Coin World* July 1 that the bureau to date had shipped 5.2 million circulation quality Kennedy half dollars to the Federal Reserve — 3 million from the Denver Mint production and 2.2 million from the Philadelphia Mint. Another 3.08 million coins — 1.54 million from each facility — were sold by the U.S. Mint above face value in bags and rolls.

3. **Coin Market Fundamentals Have Changed**, *Coin Week*, July 13, 2022. Unprecedented demand has forced rare coin prices to record-high levels across virtually all series of U.S. coinage. As auction prices climb, dealers are asking higher prices for coins in their inventories and selling has never been easier for them. However, replacing that inventory has been a huge problem for dealers. Yes, they've been having to pay ever-increasing prices, but that's not the real problem. Simply locating nice coins to purchase is where the real problem lies. The market is starved for choice coins.

4. **The Scoop from Summer FUN**, *NGC.com*, July 14, 2022. Rare coins, those in the \$5,000-to-\$25,000 range, were trading at retail prices with little effort. Dealers who were holding tables, as well as those canvassing the floor who possessed this desirable inventory, were grinning and very enthusiastic. However, the downside was sobering. According to a Midwest dealer, "the big problem is replacing this stuff." Keys and semi-keys in MS 64 and better are on many wish lists. One well-known West Coast specialist in Walkers concurs. "Fully struck, blazing white coins are bringing huge premiums. They are very difficult to replace." Another segment making noise is Standing Liberty Quarters Full Head examples graded MS 63 and better are pulling in very strong prices. The problem-free, original common coins are jumping—especially the coins in the \$500 to \$750 price point.

5. Heritage Auctions Awarded the Historic, World-Renowned Harry W. Bass Jr. Collection of Gold Coins and Patterns, *Greysheet*, July 13, 2022. The collection, which the late Dallas oilman and philanthropist Harry W. Bass Jr. began assembling in the 1960s, has been on display at the American Numismatic Association's Edward C. Rochette Money Museum in Colorado Springs, Colo., since October 2000. Earlier this year, the foundation's trustees voted to sell the collection, which contains some 450 U.S. gold coins dating to the late 1700s, to increase its annual giving – from \$2 million to at least \$5 million each year, depending on the once-in-a-lifetime auction's final results.

6. First Display of Saint-Gaudens Double Eagles and Presidential Documents at 2022 World's Fair of Money, *Coinnews.net*, July 14, 2022. Described by researchers as "one of the most important recent discoveries in 20th century American numismatics," the unique Experimental Finish 1910 Saint-Gaudens Double Eagle will be displayed alongside one of the two known Satin Finish Proof 1921 Saint-Gaudens Double Eagles at the 2022 Chicago World's Fair of Money®. It is the first time these multi-million-dollar coins will be publicly exhibited together.

7. 1907 Rolled Rim \$10 Leads Heritage U.S. Coins Auction to Nearly \$18 Million, *Coin Week*, July 19, 2022. The Rolled Rim Ten got top billing, but the event boasted strong results across the board, with 18 lots bringing six-figure results, including two – a 1943 Cent Struck on a Bronze Planchet AU50 PCGS and a 1907 Wire Rim Ten Dollar MS67 PCGS – that each drew a winning bid of \$336,000. The 1943 Lincoln cent has been called the most famous and sought-after error coin of all time. Hundreds of millions were struck each year, but when copper was needed for the World War II war effort for ammunition shell casings, 1943 cents were struck in zinc-coated steel. This previously unknown example was among a few bronze planchets that stuck in the tote bins in late 1942, only to get dislodged and fed into the presses, emerging in 1943 in a bin of zinc-coated steel cents. Demand grew, and not just because of the mere rarity. Rumors – which ultimately proved to be false – surfaced nationwide in the late 1940s that Henry Ford would give a new car to anyone who found a 1943 “copper” cent.

8. Website cites 2030 date for release of Tubman \$20 note, *Coin World*, July 16, 2022. In explaining the delay and citing other general sources, the Venturejolt website went on to detail why the Maya Angelou quarters could be made within months yet a new note is taking years, attributing it to the security standards of the Advanced Counterfeit Deterrence Steering Committee. When any new bills are created, the website reminds readers, the major concern is anti-counterfeiting technology, which involves a long process for each denomination. Since notes are more complex than coins, it involves more research and development, and materials and equipment testing. The website explained to its readers what collectors already know: Minting a coin is conducted through a completely different process by a different entity, the United States Mint, not the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. All Federal Reserve notes except for the \$1 and \$2 notes are supposed to be revised by 2034. The \$1 note cannot be changed because of a congressional mandate; the \$2 note may be updated if necessary. In 2018, the ACD Steering Committee advised that the issue dates of the \$5 and \$50 notes be switched because of security threats, but the schedule for the Harriet Tubman \$20 FRN has not

changed since 2013. The expected release dates for all denominations are: \$10, 2026; \$5, 2028; \$20, 2030; \$50, 2032; and \$100, 2034.

9. **U.S. Mint Produces Over 7.6 Billion Coins in First Half of 2022**, *Coinnews.net*, July 21, 2022. U.S. coin presses slowed for a third month in row but struck more than 1.1 billion coins for a sixth straight month and the sixteenth time in the last seventeen months, manufacturing figures from the United States Mint show. The monthly pace fell 9.1% from May and dropped 15.4% from June 2021. Still, the U.S. Mint produced over 7.6 billion coins for circulation in the first half of 2022, marking their quickest six-month start since the first half of 2016. For the monthly total, which was just above 1.1 billion coins, production was spread across cents, nickels, dimes, quarters and half dollars. In standouts, the cent ratio tally was lower than typical and half dollar mintages increased for a second consecutive month.

10. **"Extremely rare" 1,850-year-old bronze coin found in waters off Israel's coast**, *CBS*, July 26, 2022. Israeli archaeologists on Tuesday displayed a rare and "remarkably well preserved" Roman-era bronze coin dating back 1,850 years, depicting the moon goddess Luna, the first such find in Israeli waters. The coin minted in Alexandria in present-day Egypt featuring the zodiac sign Cancer below Luna and the era's Roman emperor, Antoninus Pius, on the other side, was discovered by archaeologists with the Israel Antiquities Authority during explorations off Haifa in northern Israel.

11. **Treasures from legendary 1857 "Ship of Gold" shipwreck unveiled in Nevada**, *CBS*, August 1, 2022. A mysterious daguerreotype of a woman and a pair of jeans possibly made by Levi Strauss himself are among nearly 1,000 Gold Rush-era treasures recovered from the fabled "Ship of Gold" now on display in Reno, Nevada. Since their recovery between the late 1980s and 2014, the remarkable findings extracted from the sunken S.S. Central America have been in secret storage. This week, they began a national tour at the National Antique Bottle Convention from Thursday through Sunday at the Grand Sierra Resort. This is the first public exhibition of the artifacts, which will be auctioned off later this year, the Reno Gazette Journal reported.
