News Items

1. **Monday Morning Brief for Feb. 6, 2023: Million dollar Lincoln cent**, *Coin World*, February 6, 2023. History was made on Jan. 22 when a Lincoln cent sold at auction for more than \$1 million, the first time that an example of the most produced U.S. coin reached seven figures. The coin is the finest known of the three 1958 Lincoln, Doubled Die Obverse cents known. It sold for an astounding \$1,136,250 in a GreatCollections auction.

2. **David W. Lange, 64, dies following struggle with cancer**, *Coin World*, January 19, 2023. David W. Lange — director of numismatic research at Numismatic Guaranty Co., author of nine numismatic references and honored in 2017 as the American Numismatic Association's Numismatist of the Year — died Jan. 16 in hospice at home in Bradenton, Florida, at age 64 after a long struggle with cancer. Mr. Lange is recognized as one of the hobby's most prolific researchers and authors. Lange authored *A Guide Book of Modern United States Proof Coin Sets*, *The Complete Guide to Buffalo Nickels*, *History Of The United States Mint and Its Coinage*, *The Complete Guide to Lincoln Cents*, *The Complete Guide to Mercury Dimes* and co-authored with Richard S. Montgomery the *NGC Grading Guide for Modern U.S. Coins: Grading Tips –Census Reports*.

3. **No Commem Coins in 2023**, *Coin World*, January 30, 2023. While several pieces of commemorative coin legislation were introduced during the 117th Congress in 2021 and 2022 seeking commemorative coins to be issued in calendar year 2023, none of the bills moved out of the committees where they were referred after introduction. One bill being considered to honor firefighters, if approved, this program in its original form would have resulted in 120 different coins total.

4. **Canada Dominates in COTY Category Wins**, *Numismatic News*, January 17, 2023. Canada was the country to beat as the best of the best went head-to-head in the first round of balloting for the 2022 Coin of the Year (COTY) Awards. Canada won Best Crown and Best Circulating coin awards. Austria and Ukraine are also taking home more than one trophy, with Austria winning the Bi-Metallic and Innovative categories and Ukraine coming out on top in Best Contemporary Event and Most Artistic. The United Kingdom won the Most Historically. Significant category, the United States is taking home the trophy for Best Gold, China in Best Silver, and Tokelau in Most Inspirational.
