Last Months’ Show and Tell Recap

Program

The program in June was “Dansco Albums” by Justin H. Justin is very interested in Dansco albums. He gave a little history of their start back in 1938 as the Daniel Stamp Co. In 1942 the current ownership family took over and the business, and it has been in the family ever since. In the 1960’s as stamps began to lose interest, they began producing coin albums and folders. The Continental line were red books, like today’s brown books. They were produced from about 1964-1969. They have produced many albums for various foreign coins over the years. They also have produced custom coin books for various collector tokens and coins produced by organizations such as Las Vegas Casinos and the Disney Corporation.

Justin hopes to become the top expert in Dansco albums. He was able to buy a large amount of David Lange’s collection after David’s death. David had been the de facto expert in the field of Coin boards and Coin albums, writing many different books on the subject.

President's Notes

Northside Coin Club Meeting July 11th, 2023

News Items

1. **Thomas Uram elected to position as next ANA president, Coin World, July 6, 2023.** Uram officially received one vote, all that was necessary to win since the race was uncontested. In accordance with ANA bylaws, ballots for uncontested offices are not tabulated. Only the first vote is counted. Mark Lighterman is vice president-elect, after edging out incumbent governor Rob Oberth. The ANA Board of Governors will welcome six new members for the 2023–2025 election term: John S. Brush, David G. Heinrich, Lori H. Kraft, Henry Mitchell, Phyllis A. Ross and Kenny Sammut. Incumbent member Mary Lynn Garrett was re-elected and received the most votes among board candidates.

2. **Series 2021 dollar notes now being found in circulation, Coin World, June 29, 2023.** Series 2021 \$1 Federal Reserve notes, the first notes to be printed with the signatures of the current Treasury secretary and U.S. treasurer, are being reported in circulation. The notes bear the facsimile signatures of Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen and Treasurer Lynn Malerba. Before the latter was appointed to the office in 2022, all notes produced during the first two years of the Biden administration carried the signature of officials in the same two positions in the Trump administration and bore the Series 2017A designation. The Series 2021 notes are the first to have the signatures of two women. Yellen is the first woman to occupy the office of Treasury secretary. Malerba is the first Native American to serve as Treasurer of the United States.

3. **Colombian police officer in hospital after swallowing extorted banknotes, The Guardian, June 15, 2023,** The officer had demanded payments in return for not arresting his victim on trumped-up charges – but did not know that the businessman had already reported the shakedown to Colombia's anti-kidnapping and extortion unit. When anti-corruption investigators arrived, the officer gobbled up the cash in the hope of erasing the evidence but quickly realized he had bitten off more than he could chew when the notes got lodged in his throat, blocking his airways and sending him to an emergency clinic. Videos showed the grey-faced officer pleading his innocence while in a police van after he had swallowed the nine notes in Soacha, a sprawling suburb on the edge of the capital, Bogotá. Doctors managed to remove the notes – which amounted to 500,000 pesos (£95) – and the officer was hospitalized to treat his stomach.

4. **Sold! California family sells 1 million pennies found in relative's home, msn.com, June 21, 2023,**

More than a week after capturing the interest of the entire nation, a California family's bounty of 1 million copper pennies has officially changed hands. John and Elizabeth Reyes, who discovered the massive cache of precious metal coins in the home that previously belonged to Elizabeth Reyes' father, say they've

completed a sale for the pennies. Since first speaking with NewsNation affiliate KTLA, the Reyes' story went viral, and they received no less than a thousand offers. John Reyes said he was so inundated with inquiries that many interested parties were left without an answer, their messages forever lost as social media requests and unread mail in his inbox.

The original story appeared around June 11, and at the time, the family was going to take the coins to Coinstar but balked at paying the 8% fee that Coinstar would charge to take the coins. Then they began calling around banks in L.A., but none of them were interested.
