Program

The program in July was “Collecting Mercury Dimes” by Secretary Mark H. Mark started the program with a historical perspective of the renaissance of coin designs that occurred under the Presidency of Teddy Roosevelt. The final part was a date-by-date review of the coinage from 1916 through 1945 highlighting some of the key dates and discussing the FSB designation given by the Grading companies.

Northside Coin Club Meeting August 8th, 2023

News Items

1. Report shows worldwide silver demand set a record in 2022, Coin World, May 2, 2023. Worldwide demand for silver during calendar year 2022 reached a record high of 1.242 billion ounces, according to World Silver Survey 2023, an in-depth examination of the silver market researched and produced for the Silver Institute by Metals Focus, a London-based independent precious metals conservancy. According to World Silver Survey 2023, silver bar and coin demand worldwide spiked by 22% in 2022 to a new high of 332.9 million ounces. In the United States, physical silver investment in 2022 climbed 4% to 134 million ounces compared to 129.1 million ounces in 2021. The sharpest percentage investment increase in 2022 was recorded in India, with a 188% jump to 79.4 million ounces, from 27.6 million in 2021.

2. 2023 cent has VDBV as the designer's initials, Coin World, March 27, 2023. On Feb. 18 of this year, Dave Santiago posted an image and description on Coin Community Forum of a 2023 Lincoln cent with an apparent letter V located to the right of the designer's initials (V.D.B.). The extra letter is correctly oriented and lines up perfectly with the normal letters. Santiago recovered approximately 75 examples while searching 32 rolls of Uncirculated 2023 cents (a total of 1,600 cents). He sent Mike Diamond three examples to examine. Mike suspects the extra letter was intentionally punched into or carved into a working hub by a mischievous mint employee, perhaps one whose name starts with a V.

Over 300 raw error coins have sold for as little as \$20-30 on eBay but I don't know if they were legitimate. ANACS slabbed 7 coins have sold for \$160 to \$500. NGC slabbed 8 coins have sold for \$202 to \$1,400.

3. Specially struck 2023 Peace dollars randomly shipped, Coin World, July 20, 2023, Production at the Philadelphia Mint of Uncirculated 2023-P Peace dollars included 200 coins struck July 10 by U.S. Mint Director Ventris C. Gibson and packaged with certificates of authenticity and "Congratulations" cards announcing the special strike. The boxed coins struck by Gibson were randomly inserted into shipments to customers who ordered the numismatic product. Sales for the coin opened to the public at noon Eastern Time July 13, priced at \$76.

4. Peter Jones Contributes Eight Titles to Newman Portal, E-Sylum, July 9, 2023, Peter Jones Contributes Eight Titles to Newman Portal. The works of author Peter D. Jones, MD are now available with full-view on Newman Portal, courtesy of the author. Ken Bressett's remarks from the Foreword of Commemorative Coin Tales (2018) are equally applicable to all of Jones' works: What you are about to see is one man's journey into the fascinating world of numismatics. His passion for the subject is obvious, and

likely infectious. His intent in writing this account is to inspire and pass on to his family some of the reasons he has dedicated part of his busy life to the study and collecting of these very special coins."

HOARD COINS SWITCHED FOR BETTER EXAMPLES, E-Sylum, July 23, 2023, Three coins went missing from a 56-strong Roman coin hoard discovery, only to be mysteriously replaced with ones in better condition. The more valuable replacements were noticed when photographs taken of the original first batch of money found did not match the currency sent to the British Museum for identification. All the coins, known as the Lanviet Hoard, were discovered during digs at newly ploughed fields near Bodmin over four years between October 2017 and January 2020.
