Bob C. – Had a Medallion Art Company Medal with Charles Darwin on the Obverse and a Galapagos Turtle on the reverse.

Program

The program in August was "What I learned at Summer Seminar". Four club members attended various Summer Seminar classes. Bob C. and Alex J. attended a class on Ancient Greek Coins up to Alexander the Great. The President of CNG (Classical Numismatic Group) taught the class along with one of the employees. They discussed how the rise of coins came about. How, who engraved the coin could cause the value of a coin to be different, over the same coin, engraved by a different engraver. Cities would have themes for their coins and some of the coins were Incuse designs. Of course, Turtle coins were discussed. The PowerPoint slides for the class were provided to the students. Bob C. also took the class on the Modern Minting Process, which included a field trip to Dan Carr's Moonlight mint in Loveland. This class also talked about errors and varieties. Dan R. took Intermediate grading. The class teaches the grading techniques used by the Third-Party Grading companies and Steve Feltner, one of the instructors from PCGS, explained how PCGS graded coins. Students get plenty of hands-on grading practice during the class. Mark H. took the Advanced Grading with Problem coins which helps students learn how to detect problems with coins that cause them to get Detail grades by the Grading Services. Again, students get to grade many coins, some which have problems and some that don't. Also, the instructors sit with small groups of students and give immediate feedback of the grading of each coin.

News Items

1. NGC Wins Justice with Coin Tampering Settlement, NGC web site, August 9, 2023. The defendant in the case, Richard Albright, removed NGC-certified coins from their holders and replaced them with coins of inferior grade and value. The lesser coins, which Albright encased in holders that misrepresented their authenticity and condition, were sold by him to unsuspecting collectors and dealers. As part of the settlement agreement, NGC's costs will be reimbursed, and the court also issued a permanent injunction restraining Albright from any further misrepresentation of NGC-certified coins.

2. Market Analysis: 'Morgan quarter' is 1879 pattern, Coin World, August 29, 2023. This Proof 67+ Cameo "Morgan quarter" pattern with a green CAC sticker and the gold PCGS Bass label realized \$43,200 in Pittsburgh at Heritage's auction.

3. HIKERS RISK LIVES OVER FAKE \$100S, E-Sylum v26n33, August 13, 2023, An Oregon sheriff is warning of fake \$100 bills that were thrown over Multnomah Falls and led some curious hikers to risk their lives by going to dangerous areas off-trail for the phony money. The fake \$100 bills were found Friday about 30 feet over the edge of the falls after deputies received reports of hikers attempting to retrieve what they thought was real cash, the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office said. "Because it was causing quite a stir, and fearing that someone might make a fatal mistake, the Forest Service posted signs and staffed a ranger at the upper viewing platform," the agency said in a statement. On Saturday, Portland Mountain Rescue (PMR) climbers rappelled from the crest of the falls and collected the remaining 15 bills, officials said.

4. BEALE ADMITS FALSIFYING COIN PROVENANCES, E-Sylum, August 20, 2023, Richard Beale, director of London-based auction house Roma Numismatics pleaded guilty at a New York court to a series of charges in connection with unlawful sales of rare ancient coins. Beale admitted two counts of conspiracy and three counts of criminal possession of stolen property, court documents show. He was accused of falsifying the provenance of the most expensive coin ever auctioned - the gold Eid Mar, which fetched \$4.19m (£3.29m) in 2020 - and an ancient silver Sicily Naxos Coin, which sold at the same time for \$292,000. He has also admitted to falsifying the provenance of a number of silver Alexander the Great decadrachms from the "Gaza Hoard", which were sold by Roma Numismatics and whose suspicious origin was brought to light by a BBC News Arabic documentary in 2020. The investigation documented how, three years earlier, fishermen in the Palestinian territory had discovered dozens of the coins, which date back to the 4th Century BC. Soon after the coins were found, they disappeared.
