**PROGRAM** – “El Cazador Shipwreck, That Changed The Course In US History” by club co-President Dan R.

**SHOW US YOUR COLLECTION “WALKING LIBERTY HALVES”** - This is a new club activity we are trying to start that allows club members to show off their collections. Each month we will select a type of coin. Members can then bring some examples of that coin, if they have them, to show off to the other members. You can bring a single coin, a few of your cool examples (high grade, errors, varieties, etc.), or even your whole collection. This is not a “Show and Tell” as you don’t have to stand up tell the whole club

about it. You just put your examples out and club members will walk around and look at each other's coins. Note that we are still doing the other "Show and Tell" activity.

**COIN of the MONTH** – Mercury Dime. Bring a nice, no problems coin, which you, as a collector, would like to have.

[The "Coin of the Month" works as follows. Bring a coin, of the type described as the featured coin of the month, preferably in a 2x2 or flip. If you bring a coin, you will get a ticket in the drawing and your coin goes into the pot. We then draw one ticket, and the winner gets the entire pot of coins that were featured.]

**SHOW and TELL** – Have some interesting item from your collection that you would like to show/talk about with the members.

**ANA NEWS** – A new ANA eLearning Academy is coming. On April 29<sup>th</sup>, the ANA is launching the new and improved ANA eLearning Academy to members.
